WINNIPEG, (CP)—Prices were irregular and generally easier Monday on the Winnipeg grain exchange, reflecting increased offerings and reports of hesitation on United States markets.

Base metals and uranium were weak as western oils added slightly and golds were a little higher. Noranda was up \$1 at the close to show the only senior base metal gain.

Most were down moderate amounts although Queenst was the lowest, with a 75-cent loss. Juniors were mostly steady and United Asbestos was a feature with a 20-cent loss.

Manitowadge-area issues were under profit-taking pressure following last week's strong close. Gecco was the lowest with a 25-cent loss.

Uranium and Bathurst-area base metals slipped in dull trading. Algoma gained 30 cents. Golds were slightly stronger. Kerr-Addison and Hollinger dropped 12 1/2 cents in the seniors.

In western oils Central Explorers led the majority of gainers with a 30-cent gain. Texas-Calgary, recently listed, was up 15 cents in moderate trading.

Southern and Canadian Collieries were each down 30 cents. The exchange's closing indexes showed golds up 27 at 74.63, base metals down 74 at 139.96 and western oils down 70 at 94.87.
