Education, as advocated by the New Democratic Party, the stress should be on getting money for university construction and facilities and raising the pay of the teaching staff. It was time "we got our heads out of the clouds".

Maurice Allard (Ind.-PC—Sherbrooke) said the bill is unconstitutional. The British North America Act gave the provinces responsibility for education. The federal government was trying to do indirectly what it could not do directly.

It was possible that all provinces except Quebec have no objection to Ottawa intruding into the field. But Quebec wanted to be mistress over education and other matters granted to it by the constitution. He suggested the central government return tax fields it took from the provinces. In this way, the provinces would be able to discharge their responsibilities for education.

J. Patrick Nowlan (PC—Digby—Annapolis—Kings) said figures show that the loan fund is being used in all parts of Canada. It was doing the job it had been designed to do—help children of lower-income families get a higher education.

A drawback in the Maritime provinces, however, was that the government's tight money policy was holding back university expansion.

SHOULD PROVIDE AID
Creditist Leader Real Caquette said education was a provincial responsibility which the federal government should only aid.

The best way would be to make money available to provincial governments to assist needy students.

It was not helping by allowing students to take out loans which they would have to repay in five or six years, "just at the time when their other monetary obligations are great."

J. A. Mongrain (Ind.—Trois-Rivieres) said he did not believe the bill encroached on provincial jurisdiction.

Gerald W.M. Baldwin (PC—Peace River) supported the bill but said that the constitutional problem of the provinces' jurisdiction in the field of education needs consideration.

But he could see no reason why Parliament should not deal with the student loans legislation.

RARE TREE DIES

MONTREAL (CP)—A ginkgo tree, a landmark on the McGill University campus which stood at the site of the tomb of James McGill in front of the old arts building since around the turn of the century, has died and been felled. Only a few of the ancient species of tree, dating back some 300,000,000 years, are said to have survived the glacial period. They were saved from extinction by Chinese holy men who considered them sacred. The ginkgo is sometimes known as the maidenhair tree.
