Beside the above, Mr. Kane sent 150 fat sheep to St. John's, Nfld, average price \$4, total value \$600.

--A number of ladies and gentlemen contemplate the organization of a branch of the Canadian Historical Society in Charlottetown. The rapidly rising status of Canada among the nations of the world, has of late been conspicuously evident. A unity of national purpose and a high ideal of loyalty and patriotism in her people will alone sustain her in that high position. A thorough acquaintance by her people with her heroic past is of the first importance. Her history, literature, poetry and art are yearly becoming more valuable in affording the necessary knowledge. An intelligent and self-respecting national pride in Canadian literature needs to be awakened and encouraged. The value of documents, records, and relics, both public and private, as notes in the history of a people is not generally realized. The collection and preservation of them is most important.

If the effort succeeds in Charlottetown it is hoped that much valuable material relating to our own Province may be collected and preserved. The society would not in any way interfere with the labours of the Natural History and Antiquarian Society, which is doing good work in our city. On the contrary, the societies could be mutually helpful. We hope to see the society formed at no distant date.
