### Local and Other Items.

**DIED UNDER CHLOROFORM**—A little boy met death at Ritcey's Cove on Monday under very sad circumstances. Bertie, the 10-year-old son of Stephen Ritcey was playing with a bicycle and twirling one of the wheels, when his hand got caught between the wheel and sprocket and was badly crushed. A doctor who was summoned to attend the injured had administered chloroform to the boy, who died while under the anesthetic. The little fellow was of very delicate constitution.—Halifax Echo.

**A WORLD-WIDE PROBLEM**—A determined stand has been made against the theatre hat in Lille. The mayor of that town has just issued an edict against the colossal hats and elevated coiffures adopted by ladies who attend the play. The order is short and severe, and states that low coiffures must in future be worn in the stalls of the theatres, hats being absolutely forbidden. It remains to be seen whether this courageous functionary will be able to enforce his order. They have failed in Paris and London. Will they succeed in Lille?—Newcastle Daily Leader.

**A BAD ACCIDENT**—An accident resulting in the death of one man and injury to another occurred at Dufferin mines, Salmon River, Halifax county, a few days ago. Four men were at work in a vertical shaft sinking with air drills. One of these drilled into the bottom of a previously blasted hole in which there evidently remained some unexplored dynamite. The blow of the drill set this one tearing away fragments of the rock surrounding the hole. Flying pieces struck two men at the drill, fatally injuring a helper and wounding a driller in the head. The driller was Sylvester Carroll, a native of Newfoundland. The helper, Edward Spencer, was a native of Buxton, Derbyshire, England.

**YELLOW FEVER**—Two hundred cases of yellow fever are reported in the United States military camp at Juragua, and the disease is spreading. Dr Senn, the medical expert, says there will be 2,000 if the army is there two weeks longer. The camp at Juragua seems to have suffered from want of proper care in the hurry of landing, as at other nearby points where troops are gathered, the disease has not appeared. It is doubtful if, in connection with any military expedition, such provision for medical care of the troops was made as has been the case with the United States army in Cuba. That disease has gotten a hold in the camps shows how difficult it is to keep it out rather than that the direction was wrong.
