A "SWING" HAND

In today's deal, North-South (both rated as experts) used up six rounds of bidding—to get into the wrong contract!

North dealer.
 Both sides vulnerable.
 North-South 60 on score.

♠ 5 5
 ♥ A K Q 10 6 1
 ♦ 8 4 3
 ♣ K Q

♠ J 7 6 2
 ♥ 9 8 5
 ♦ 4
 ♣ 6 4 3 2

The bidding:
 North East South West
 1♥ Pass 3♦ Pass
 3♥ Pass 3♠ Pass
 4♦ Pass 5♠ Pass
 5♥ Pass 6♦ Dbl.
 Pass Pass 6♠ Rdbl.
 Pass Pass

West opened his singleton heart, and when it was all over, South found himself down two tricks, 1000 points!

In view of the fact that North-South could have earned 1440 points by reaching six notrump, which could have been made without great difficulty, the "swing" against them in this deal came to almost 2500 points!

The first two rounds of bidding require no comment. It was South's decision to make a five-club cue bid, instead of bidding four notrump, which was, in its effect, the first step in the wrong direction. South should have been highly interested in his partner's kings, and after getting a formal response to four notrump, it would certainly be in order to make the inquiry about kings with five notrump.

The really inexcusable bids in this sequence, however, were contributed by West and South! West should not have dreamed of doubling six diamonds and warning the enemy, whereas South, for his part, should not have dreamed of staying at six diamonds, let alone redoubling. He should have been very glad to accept West's suggestion, and run out to six notrump.
