Let's Talk It Over

The frills which the modern schools are being accused of harbouring are seldom indicated by name. They are only referred to generally, and rather vaguely as "frills". A recent local speaker threw a little more light on them when he said that the schools are being overloaded with matters which are the responsibility of the homes.

THE TROUBLE with calling many things the responsibilities of the homes is that, unfortunately, a certain percentage of our homes are totally irresponsible. Strictly speaking, it would be right to say that the matter of doing good or evil is the responsibility of each individual citizen, but in spite of this we must have our churches, and kindred organizations to keep morally on as high a plane as possible.

IF TOO MANY responsibilities are left to the home, the "like father, like son" will become an even stronger truth than it is at present. It is the privilege and the opportunity of the school to do a leveling job by which the children of the poorly disciplined homes are brought up a little closer to the level of the more favored families.

Big Planes Return From Arctic Flight

The end of an epoch in the history of R.C.A.F. Station, Summerside took place last evening with the return of three Lancaster aircraft from a specialist navigation training flight to Resolute Bay from which Arctic training flights were made.
