Flying Officer Peter Alfred Hawkes

It was with profound sorrow that relatives and the many friends in Charlottetown and Duncan, B.C., learned of the tragic death on Oct. 31, 1954, in a plane crash at St. Hubert, Que., of Flying Officer Peter Alfred Hawkes.

Pete, as he was familiarly known, had spent two weeks with his wife and family in Charlottetown, and was returning to his base when, after surviving one accident at Bangor, Maine, the previous day, he was killed in a second accident, Sunday, Oct. 31.

He was well and favourably known in Charlottetown and Summerside, having graduated as a navigator in Course 16 at R. C. A. F. Station, Summerside. At the time of his death he was attached to No. 424 All-Weather Jet Fighter Squadron, St. Hubert, Que.

Born in Lloydminster, Sask., he later moved with his family to Duncan, B. C. Upon graduating from High School, he joined the R. C. A. F.

He is survived by his wife, the former Olive Downe and little daughter, Catharine, also a son, Peter Wakeford, who passed away Oct. 12th, 1954, aged two weeks; his father, Cecil Wakeford Hawkes, Duncan, B. C.; two brothers, John, Paradise Valley, Alberta, and Michael, Duncan, B. C.; one sister, Gwendolyn, Mrs. James Reynolds, Lloydminster, Sask. His mother predeceased him, Jan 1st, 1950.
