

Helicopter Makes Mercy Flight To Bayside, P.E.I.

A mercy flight to Bayside, near Grand River, was completed last evening by a helicopter from the naval base at Shearwater, N. S. when Mr. Basil Morrison, aged about 75, was flown from his home to the Prince County Hospital after it was found to be impossible to retrieve him in any other manner, due to impassable road conditions.

Dr. G.E. Robinson, Tyne Valley contacted the commanding officer of R.C.A.F. Station Summerside early last evening, after it was found that Mr. Morrison was very ill and badly in need of oxygen and that it was necessary to get him to hospital in Summerside.

Group Captain Swetman got in touch with the Rescue Co-Ordination Centre in Halifax, who in turn contacted the air station, Shearwater. A helicopter, piloted by Lt. Commander E. A. Fallen, was doing routine night flying at the time and was directed to Summerside by Search and Rescue headquarters.

The copter got the urgent message about 8.20 and touched down in Summerside at the R. C. A. F. Station about 9.45 after getting the necessary information the helicopter took off for Bayside and landed in a field near the home of Mr. Morrison, aided by cars and trucks

who directed their headlights on the field and also by the use of the helicopter's landing lights. F.L.I. (Dr.) Cullinan and P.O. (Nurse) Arac from the Summerside R.C.A.F. Station accompanied the helicopter crew and soon Mr. Morrison was loaded onto the plane by means of a stretcher. The helicopter flew back to R.C.A.F. Station Summerside and from there Mr. Morrison was removed to the Prince County Hospital by R.C.A.F. ambulance.

Other members of the helicopter crew were Co-Pilot, Lt. R.J. McClymont and Able Seaman M. Girardin.
