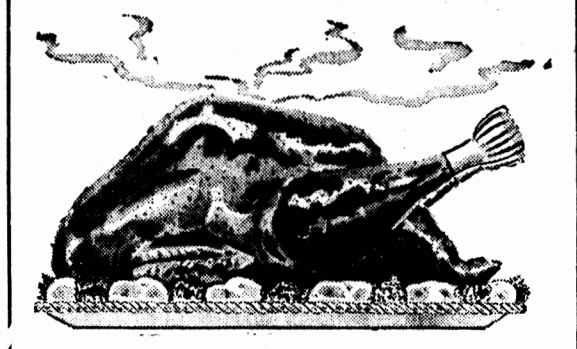

NEWSY NOTES

Island Lots
The settlement and development of the Isle de St. Jean was hampered and delayed for a century by the action of the British Government in arranging that it should be parcelled out in large grants, by lot, to persons, many of whom were only interested as land speculators.

The Holland Survey
Captain Samuel Holland was appointed Surveyor General of Canada on March 13th, 1764. The British Government had ordered a general survey of British North America, and Captain, afterwards Major Holland was ordered to start this work on the Island.

The Tenant League
The settlers who took up land in the different lots were tenants, they had to pay rent, the improvements they made in clearing land and putting up buildings increased the value to the landlord who could raise the rent.

The Landlords
The proprietors in accepting the grants of their lots, in 1767 had agreed along with the reservation of areas for public, religious and educational purposes, and for fishing and mining, to very definite terms regarding quit rents, and the settlement of their townships within ten years.
