Delegation Runs Into Georgia's Segregation Laws

LOVEJOY, Ga., Dec. 26—(AP)—Six white and four Negro women interlocking for Rosa Lee Ingram, convicted Negro murderer, bumped into Georgia's segregation laws today and were rebuffed by Governor Herman Talmadge.

THE GOVERNOR refused to discuss clemency for the controversial life-termer with the New York group. He indirectly compared their visit with a New York demonstration by Julius Rosenberg and his wife Ethel, under a death sentence for treason.

TALMADGE met the 10 in the driveway of his plantation home here. Arriving a few minutes earlier by taxi from Atlanta, the women had been invited by the Governor to await his return in segregated racial groups.

"We have segregation here," Mrs. Talmadge told them. "The white ladies are welcome to come inside and the colored ladies may wait with some nice colored people here on the farm."

THE WOMEN spurned the offer and waited in the driveway in their cabs. Elaine Ross of New York, a representative of the Civil Rights Congress, listed twice by the Department of Justice as Communist, told Talmadge she and the others were "shocked" when state troopers stopped them when they tried to pay for Christmas Day visit to Mrs. Ingram in penitentiary.

THE GOVERNOR replied that the state merely was guarding against a possible riot. Talmadge explained that state law gave him no power to pardon or parole Mrs. Ingram, convicted with her two young sons of murdering an aged tenant farmer in 1947 in a dispute over straying livestock.

Grandma Tried Bank Robbery Once Too Often

LOS ANGELES, Dec. 26—(AP)—Grandma, who pulled a toy gun on a bank teller once too often, revealed herself today as a one-time daughter of wealth, educated at the best schools, polished by travel in Europe.

SHE SAID her father lost his \$200,000 fortune in Wall Street in the crash of 1929, and she turned to robbery when arthritis crippled her hands. She insisted it was a Robin Hood sort of career—she gave her money to others.

HER FATHER, said grandma, was a New York and Philadelphia financier, the late Robert M. Catts, who made his vast take in real estate and construction financing.

BUT REPORTS from the east indicated that her description of his opulence may have been somewhat overdrawn.

CHARGED in three counts of bank robbery, Mrs. Ethel Arata, 52, told Commissioner Howard V. Calverly in federal court that she wished to plead guilty and did not want a lawyer. But he ordered her plea delayed until Jan. 9 to give a grand jury a chance to look into her case.

SHE WAS captured Christmas eve by the manager of a bank in nearby Arcadia, moments after she failed to bluff a woman teller with a toy pistol. Later, to police, she admitted she held up branches here of the California Bank on Oct. 17 and the Citizens National Bank Nov. 26, getting a total of \$1,469.

SHE DENIED a third robbery, of \$2,600 from the Union Bank & Trust Company here, and a teller could not identify her. So police now are looking for another grandma.

Boxing Day Observance In Great Britain

By Glennie Currie LONDON, Dec. 26—(Reuters)—There are a dozen names for the day after Christmas, but in Britain it's "Boxing Day," when John Bull traditionally takes his family to the theatre, the football stadium or the track.

A legal holiday, it's called "Boxing" Day because it used to be the day Christmas "boxes" were given to tradesmen and distributed to the poor.

LONDON'S theatreland, deserted Christmas Day, came to life with a bang this afternoon. Thousands crammed into the district, but not to see anything as strong as Shakespeare, Shaw or Eugene O'Neill. The big attraction was pantomime—an English mixture of music, gags and shapely girls.

ELSEWHERE in the country, movie houses and community halls in many places have reverted to playhouses where, for a couple of weeks second-string pantomime companies dress up old fairy tales in jokes and songs.

THIS YEAR Londoners have eight of the 100-odd professional "pantomimes" being played in Britain. They range from "Humpty Dumpty" to "Beauty and the Beast," and include the inevitable "Peter Pan."

LONDON also has three "mammoth" circuses, three miscellaneous "Christmas shows," two pantomimes on ice and a rollicking musical treatment of an old melodrama, "Maria Marten," or "The Murder in the Old Red Barn."

FOR those with most sophisticated tastes, there are four United States musical comedies now playing in London. "Call Me Madam," "South Pacific," "Porgy and Bess" and a revival of "Oklahoma."

BESIDES the indoor entertainment, there was plenty going on outside, centring around the professional and amateur football games.

DEC. 26 also is St. Stephen's Day, the traditional "Feast of Stephen" when, according to the carol, Good King Wenceslas looked out.

Don't Expect Churchill To Visit Canada

OTTAWA, Dec. 26—(CP)—Official Ottawa does not expect Prime Minister Churchill to visit Canada as part of his January trip to North America.

SENIOR officials said today this looks primarily like a holiday trip to Jamaica for the British leader and that he has given no indication that he intends or wants to come to Ottawa.

NORMALLY, Ottawa would have heard before the announcement if Mr. Churchill had any intention of coming here. He was here a year ago after his call on President Truman in Washington.

THE feeling in some quarters here is that Mr. Churchill will come again to the U. S. sometime in the spring and probably then visit Canada.

Probe Killing Of Negro Motorist

HOMESTEAD, Fla., Dec. 26—(AP)—Investigation of the Christmas Day killing of a Negro motorist by a policeman was started today at a closed hearing.

THERE was a possibility that the Federal Bureau of Investigation would be asked to determine whether the Federal Civil Rights Act had been violated.

EMMETT Jefferson, 30, was killed in the yard of his home by Patrolman Paul Minnick after a chase which started after a Negro had forced a woman driver off the road.

LAWYER George Everett charged that the shooting was unnecessary and that the wrong man was slain. He said the woman forced off the road told him "Jefferson was not the man involved."

MINNICK was suspended pending the inquiry. After reports that a speeding automobile had forced the woman driver off the road, Patrolman William Fasulo arrested Jefferson at the home of a friend in Florida City. He said Jefferson escaped in his car. Fasulo gave chase and Minnick and Sgt. J. C. Arrant joined in the pursuit. Fasulo arrested Jefferson as the Negro pulled into the yard of his home here.

FASULO said Jefferson "started to scuffle" and Minnick shot him down.

Continued from page 1 a movie scenario. "They came in and said he could go for a ride," Sincore recalled.

"WE drove off as it fell dark. I soon lost all sense of time...after some hours the car stopped and I was asked to get out by the Russian with the gun. We got out and stood in the dark by the roadside...the armed Russian jumped back into the car.

"I grabbed at the door handle but it was locked and the car...drove off, leaving me in the dark in a wood without the least idea where I was. Suddenly the car turned around and drove back at high speed toward me...I jumped off the road and got behind a tree."

"The car lights failed to pick me up and the car drove off again," he said.

HE reached a small village and a German woman led him through a wood and then pointed toward Berlin.

SINCORE walked on until he saw the familiar uniform of a West German policeman and then waited for a police car to pick him up.

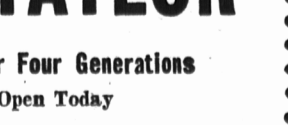
Bring the candles, light the tree, There's something Christmas does to me, It weaves a charm, it casts a spell, It sheds a warmth I cannot tell.
