Unemployment Claims Drop

OTTAWA (CP)—Initial and renewal claims for unemployment insurance benefits declined for the third successive month in June but were well above the corresponding month last year, the bureau of statistics said today.

Claims in June totalled 86,419, compared with 104,326 in May and 55,212 in the corresponding month a year ago. The bureau said the decline in June from May "is in keeping with the normal trend for this season of the year."

However, June claims represent an increase of some 35 per cent over last year. On a provincial basis claims rose about 80 per cent in Ontario, Alberta and British Columbia.

Initial and renewal claims filed in June with last year's figure in brackets: Newfoundland, 1,346 (1,065); Prince Edward Island, 246 (216); Nova Scotia, 1,213 (2,433); New Brunswick, 2,759 (1,935); Quebec, 25,782 (19,838).
