The Arab shrugs his shoulders, a French trick that follows their conquests, and so is very suggestive.

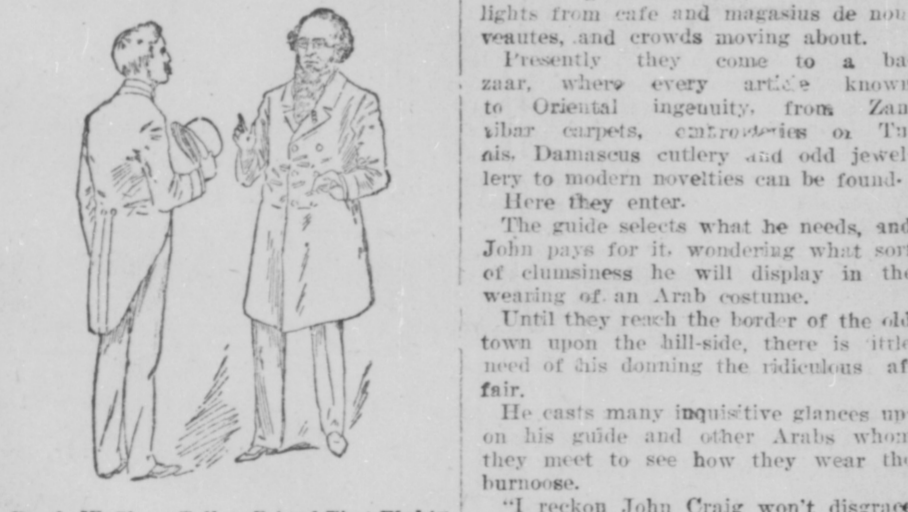
"The Moorish doctor; he lives in the heart of the old town."
