Expect Solvency Of Sterling Areas

LONDON, Jan. 26 - (Reuters) - Financial circles here believe the decisions concealed in the Commonwealth Finance Ministers' communique yesterday should succeed in restoring the sterling area's solvency—but it will be a close fight in the next few months. Plans to be announced by individual governments in the sterling area will prove to be more drastic than is suggested by what appear at first sight to be platitudes in the communique's wording. The conference has in fact succeeded far beyond the expectations held when it assembled, these circles say. Chief decision of the conference is that each Finance Minister has accepted a target for his own country's surplus or deficit on its balance of payments so that the sum for the sterling area as a whole can add up to the right answer of a balance with the non-sterling world by the second half of this year. Financial circles believe it is a great advance that the fight against inflation in each sterling country has been put in the forefront. Increasing exports and borrowing abroad are recognized to be less important. Import cuts, which used to be the head, now are at the foot of the list—though there will have to be plenty of them. This recognizes that the adverse balance of payments is merely a symptom of internal inflation in each sterling country and that the attack must be directed against the inflation rather than by export drives or import cuts, which are merely concerned with the symptoms. Tighter credit policy may be applied in most every sterling country.

Life Insurance Co. Opposes Annuities

Pointing out that subsidized government annuities unjustly favoured the annuity purchaser at the expense of those who saved through other channels such as homes farms, small businesses and other investments, President John G. Parker of The Imperial Life expressed the opposition of his Company to the further liberalization of government annuity provisions. Speaking at the Annual Meeting of Imperial Life, he said "In the last session of Parliament a Bill was introduced to increase the amount of the annuity available to any one purchaser and also to grant cash surrender values in government annuity contracts. Both of these changes were distinctly contrary to the former policy of the government as evidenced by the statements made at the time of the passing of the original Act and during the years in which these annuities have been sold. Although the bill was not passed it must be anticipated that a similar bill will be introduced next session. It is my belief, as I stated previously, that the life insurance companies are playing a vital part in mobilizing the savings of Canada—a function of the utmost importance to the national economy. It is the belief of the companies that these proposed amendments to the Government Annuities Act would seriously interfere with this vital task. "The life insurance companies are firm believers in our free enterprise system and are opposed to any unnecessary encroachment of government in fields of endeavour already satisfactorily served by private business. They think it only reasonable that people who desire to supplement their universal old age benefits by the practice of individual thrift should do so by purchasing annuities or insurance policies from one of the many life insurance companies or by using other savings institutions. "It does not seem just or reasonable that the man who invests heavily in government annuities should receive a subsidy which is not enjoyed by those who save through other channels such as homes farms, small businesses and other investments. In addition, the inequitable distribution of such a subsidy creates many injustices even under present conditions, and it is obvious that a further increase in the amount of the annuity available will only serve to aggravate the situation. DIAMOND MARKET TO BE OPENED UP

Out to break what he calls a world-wide sales monopoly on diamonds, magnate plans to sell output of his Mwadui mine at Tanganyika, Africa, to Canada and the Latin American countries. First formal notice given concerning the new policy in the sale of the stones came at the turn of the year, when Williamson did not renew a marketing agreement with the Diamond Trading Corp., the selling agency of the big South African De Beers mining organization, headed by Sir Ernest Oppenheimer. A quarrel over the size of the payment the corporation—which controls the sale of a great bulk of the entire world's current production of diamonds—paid for the output of the Mwadui mine, discovered a decade ago by Williamson and reputed to be the richest diamond mine in the world, broke up the business arrangement between two of the world's wealthiest men.
