Taxation in Canada.

INSTEAD of frankly admitting that it had deceived its readers to the extent of about \$8,000,000 when it stated that the total revenue of the Government was the measure of the people's taxation, the Patriot changes its ground and plays upon a phrase used by THE EXAMINER.

But neither great cleverness nor great wit are required to mark the distinction which exists between payments which are freely made to the Government for the immediate purpose of obtaining particular services from the Government, and taxes which are imposed by the Government for the purpose of maintaining the various public services of the country.

Taxation is, undoubtedly, somewhat heavier now than it was in 1878. In point of fact, the average tax paid per head of the population was, in 1878, \$4.37, and in 1888 \$5.67—a difference of \$1.30.

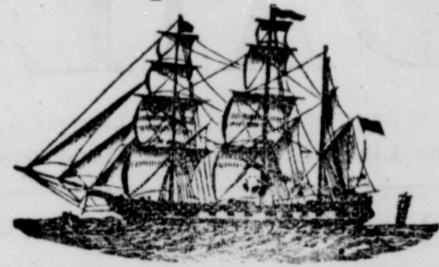
