One night recently he read after returning home from a sick call, and on awaking in the morning he experienced a slight dimness of vision. Gradually his sight became worse and by the afternoon he was stone blind and could not see a ray of sunlight even when looking at the sun. The best Halifax doctors extend no hope of recovery. The trouble is an effusion of blood on the optic nerves.
