With an obvious smack at the Boy and Girl Scouts, an official description of the Young Pioneers declares: "In organization and program it is a complete departure from colonial youth movements and other colonial hangovers with their cult of romanticism, exclusivism and loyalties to another time and place."

Boys And Girls In Ghana Pledge Loyalty To 'Redeemer' Nkrumah

ACCRA, Ghana (AP)—In an assembly hall in downtown Accra 100 boys and girls raised right hands and pledge to "live by the ideals of the redeemer, Kwame Nkrumah, founder of the state of Ghana, initiator of the African personality."

Then the children, from tots of four to youths of 17, chant in unison: "Nkrumah does no wrong. Nkrumah is our leader. Nkrumah is our messiah. Nkrumah never dies."

Survey Team Planning Probe Of Arctic Magnetic Field

OTTAWA (CP)—An airborne survey team from the Dominion Observatory left Ottawa last week to record the magnetic fields of the Canadian Arctic over a 2,500,000-square-mile area.

The team, using a huge magnetometer installed in a four-engine transport aircraft, will operate in darkness for nearly a month with only the stars for navigation.

The operation must be conducted in the blackness of the Arctic winter because compasses are not sufficiently reliable to permit such observations during the Arctic summer period of almost total daylight.

Compasses don't work in the North because of the existence of the North Magnetic Pole. It also is not possible in the summer to use stars for navigation.

The magnetometer has been installed in a DC-4 supplied for the \$100,000 survey operation by the Wardair Canada Limited. The plane will make 14 separate flights, travelling more than 57,000 miles from four Arctic bases — Titus in Greenland, Resolute in Cornwallis Island, Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories and Inuvik at the mouth of the Mackenzie River which empties into the Beaufort Sea.

The operation forms part of the World Magnetic Survey organized by the International Union of Geodesy and Geophysics to record all of the earth's magnetic fields by 1965.

The area to be surveyed in Canada this year includes all of the Arctic islands and a huge section of the western Arctic Ocean. At one point the plane will take magnetic readings directly over the geographical North Pole.

One of the 14 flights will be to locate the current position of the wandering North Magnetic Pole which was positioned on the southwest corner of Bathurst Island in 1962. Since 1831 the Magnetic Pole has moved 400 miles in a northwest direction from a point off the west coast of Booth's Peninsula.
