**Drivers Are Ordered To Share Damages Costs In Collision**

That both drivers were guilty of negligence was the finding of Mr. Justice Mark R. MacGuigan in an action for damages that was concluded in Supreme Court, Summerside yesterday, in which the plaintiffs were Garth Edwards, a taxi driver and Mrs. Marion MacRae, both of Summerside and the defendants were Mr. Edgar Smallman and his son, James Smallman of O'Leary.  
The drivers of the vehicles involved in the accident, Garth Edwards and James Smallman, were ordered to share equally the cost of damages to the vehicles which was estimated at \$1,102.56. Estimate of damage to the Smallman vehicle was \$385.85 and to the Edwards' taxi, \$476.71. Mr. Edwards was also allowed \$40 for loss of his vehicle during an estimated repair period of five days. Vehicle repair costs were estimated by garages as neither car was repaired.  
Mrs. Marion MacRae, the co-plaintiff, who was a passenger in the taxi at the time of the accident and who sustained an injury to her right arm received judgment in her favor against the defendants for \$81.00 which was fifty per cent of the \$162.00 estimated cost of damages due to doctor's bill and hired help while her arm was incapacitated.

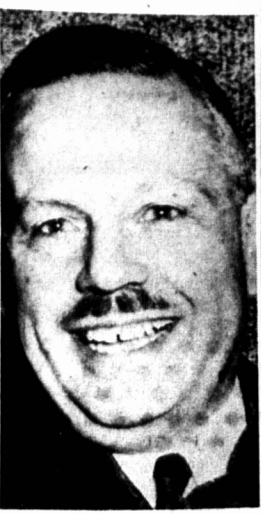

**Fleming Says Maritimers Are "Forgotten People"**

The people of the Maritime area, treated the way they have, year in and year out by the Federal Liberal Government, are the forgotten people of Canada, said Mr. J. Donald Fleming, Progressive Conservative member of Parliament and candidate for that party in Toronto Eglinton in the June election, in addressing a public meeting at Central Bedouque last evening.  
When the government during the war was spending billions of dollars, when they were locating industries here and there, one would have thought they would have grasped the opportunity to strengthen the Maritime area by locating industries here, but they passed up the opportunity, and during the past seven-year period of rearmament, when over ten billion dollars have been spent, how much of it has been used in the development of secondary industry in the Atlantic area, he asked.

"It has been one of my jobs in Parliament," said Mr. Fleming, "to be the critic of the Department of Defence Production, and I have pressed that point home on Mr. C.D. Howe, and he can't even tell me whether any contracts have worked through to the Maritime Provinces."  
**AVERAGE WAGE**  
Mr. Fleming said it might be like pouring salt into open wounds to remind the people of the Atlantic area of some hard facts such as the average weekly earnings in the Atlantic area, according to government figures, which at the beginning of this year, indicated Prince Edward Island was at the bottom of the list with average weekly earnings of \$47.74, with Nova Scotia reported at \$52.66, N.B. at \$56.95, while Ontario was \$65.73, Alberta \$66.02, and B.C. at \$68.21.  
He reminded his listeners that the population of the Atlantic Provinces has not been moving forward as has the population in other parts of Canada.  
In the last nine years the debt of Prince Edward Island has increased by 78 per cent, according to figures issued last summer by the Citizens Research Institute of Canada, and it was estimated that P.E.I. now has per capita debt of \$153.70, a figure exceeded in Canada only by the two other Maritime Provinces, he said.

**TAX DIVISION**

On the subject of Dominion-Provincial relations, Mr. Fleming said the Liberal Government at Ottawa has shown itself indifferent and arrogant in relation to the need for readjustment in the division of revenues between the Dominion and Provinces from joint fields of taxation. The Federal Government has not yet recognized that it can be done without increasing taxes," said Mr. Fleming. "The Liberal Government was politically embarrassed by the size of its huge budget surplus of last year which was half a billion dollars." It was so big, he said, that it meant that every man, woman or child in Canada last year was overtaxed by \$30.00 by this government.
