**Memorial Service At Kensington**

Kensington Presbyterian Church was filled to capacity on Sunday morning Nov. 11th, when worshippers from sister communions joined in the Remembrance Day service, which was conducted by the Rev. E. C. Evans, supplying minister, assisted by the Rev. L. M. Murray of the United Church and the Rev. R. W. Coupland of the Anglican Church.

Returned men, Girl Guides and Brownies attended in a body after marching via the corner of Main and Hartle Streets where those of the Roman Catholic faith formed up in separate parade to proceed to the Roman Catholic Church.

The address was delivered by the Rev. Mr. Evans, who took for his text, the words, "What mean ye by this service?" found in Exodus 12-28. When future generations ask this question, it will not be enough to answer that those who gave their lives in the cause of freedom are being honored. The world must be educated in the cause of peace and such education should begin with the young child, by planting in his mind justice and tolerance in place of hatred and greed. This is one way in which each can do his or her part in educating the world for peace.

The speaker said, "Only the power and grace of the Lord Jesus Christ can bring peace to this troubled world," but we, as His followers, must do much more than honor the dead on Remembrance Day, if we are to give a sincere answer to the question, "What mean ye by this service?"

The hymns in keeping with the day included Kipling's "Lest We Forget", sung by the choir as an offertory.
