### Expansion Continued In Canada's Trade In July

OTTAWA (CP) - Canada's trade continued to expand in July with both exports and imports showing gains in value over July last year, the bureau of statistics reported Thursday.

Rise in the value of imports, which has been general this year, was slightly greater than that of exports, which have had uninterrupted monthly gains since October last year.

Total exports in July were valued at \$357,000,000, up 8.5 per cent from \$329,100,000 in July, 1954. Imports were estimated at \$372,800,000, an increase of 9.3 per cent over \$341,200,000 last year.

Rise in imports was due to increased purchases from the United States. Imports from the United Kingdom and other regions were slightly lower in value.

#### BETTER IMPORT BALANCE

The month's trade resulted in a moderate increase in the import balance to \$15,800,000 from \$12,100,000 for July last year.

In the seven months ended July 31, total exports were valued at \$2,420,100,000, nearly 10 per cent above last year's figure. The record for this period is \$2,496,900,000 in 1952 when grain shipments were exceptionally high.

Value of imports in the seven months rose to \$2,582,200,000, al-

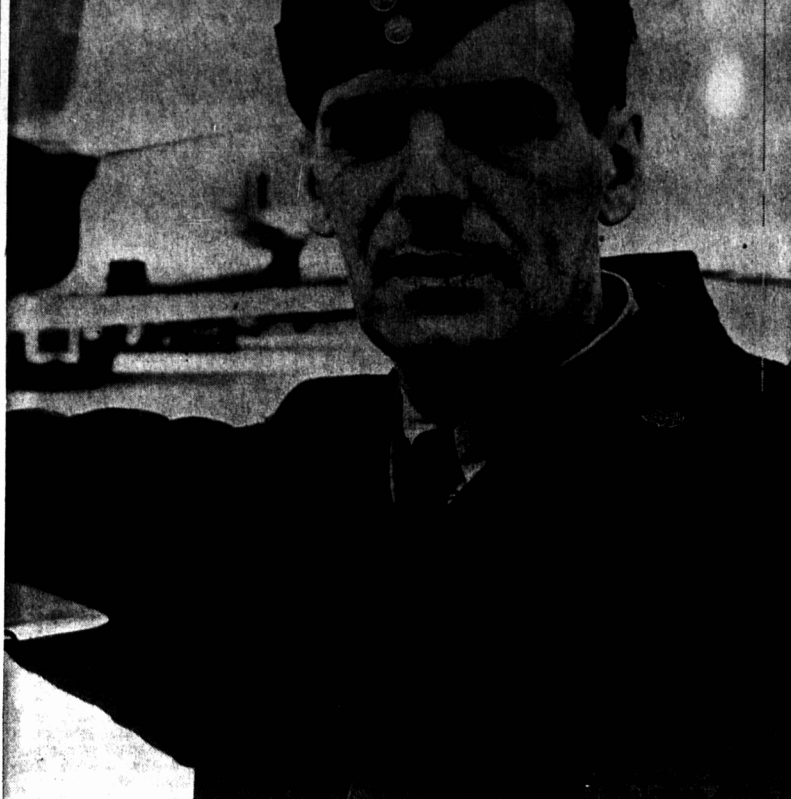

### Youthful Hoodlum Shot By Police After Attack

NEW YORK (AP) - A policeman shot and wounded a 15-year-old boy in Harlem early Thursday while pursuing five youngsters who set flaming torches to the feet of an ice peddler.

Joe Lee Louis, 36, said the boys used torches made of paper and cardboard on him when he refused to hand over about \$95 he had hidden. One held a knife at his back and two grasped his arms during the attack.

When patrolman Robert Larkin arrived at the scene, the boys fled. Larkin fired a warning shot, then several more.

Four of the youths escaped, but Larkin captured a 15-year-old boy who had been shot in the leg. He was charged with juvenile delinquency.

Louis was treated for third-degree burns.

### Greeks Have Developed Taste For Canadian Spuds

MONTREAL (CP) - Howard W. Richardson, Canadian commercial attache in Athens, says Canadian exports to Greece, Turkey and Israel this year will amount to approximately \$5,000,000 compared with an average of \$10,000,000 a year.

Inflationary conditions in Turkey, the release of surplus United States wheat to Israel, and the natural poverty of Greece were to blame, Mr. Richardson said in an interview Tuesday.

He is touring eastern Canada to advise private firms on the best methods to improve trade with the three countries.

Mr. Richardson said the Greeks have developed a liking for Canadian potatoes. Exports of Canadian seed potatoes, which topped a value of \$200,000 last year, have been maintained.

## Concentrate On Security, Stock Market Leaders Say

VANCOUVER (CP) - Take it from the leaders of the biggest stock exchanges in North America—forget about the "fast killing" and concentrate on security.

The advice came from the stock market leaders attending the convention here of the National Association of Securities Administrators.

All agreed that the man of average means with money to invest should concentrate on security and not speculative issues and forget about the "fast killing."

Their advice is based on the principle that there is no easy way to riches on the stock market.

### CAUTIOUS ADVICE

In an interview, the men were asked what advice they would give the working man seeking a fortune on a \$5,000 investment. "Watch out," is the phrase that capsules their reaction.

"That type of man is badly in need of a financial education which could cost him every cent of his savings."

Keith Funston, president of the New York stock exchange, said: "I would tell him to put his \$5,000 in a savings account and government bonds. Nobody should invest in common stock until he has provided for emergencies through savings or bonds; and, against catastrophe, through life insurance."

James B. Weir, chairman of the Montreal stock exchange: "I would definitely advise him to stay away from speculative issues. They are for people who can afford to take the gamble, not for the poor man. I would say that he should buy only blue chips, provided he keeps some of the \$5,000 for emergencies. There is no such thing as a formula for getting rich quick."

MOSCOW, Idaho AP - Social standing is mighty important to a cow, says G. C. Anderson, dairy specialist at the University of Idaho.

He says recent studies indicate a newcomer which threatens the position of the rest of the cows in a herd is the most frequent cause of psychological uproar that can cause milk and butterfat production to drop as much as five per cent.
