Two-Year Term In Theft Case

Death Yesterday Of Mr. Thos. J. Arbing

Mr. Thomas J. Arbing, retired C.N.R. station agent, passed away at his home at 3 Escher Street, yesterday at the age of 85. The late Mr. Arbing was born at Suffolk, P.E.I. At an early age he became employed with the Turner Co., Leary and at the age of 21 entered the service of the Prince Edward Island Railway first as a brakeman, but a few years later he was appointed telegraph operator, an occupation which he was industrious enough to learn by study in his spare time.
