

Scantlebury Business Establishment Expanded

Bringing to an expanding business the experience of more than forty years as a successful artistic sign painter and decorator, Mr. Wallace Scantlebury has taken his son George into partnership under the firm name of "Scantlebury Signs and Plastics", located in expanded and remodelled quarters at 36 Kent St.

Following the modern trend the firm is producing a variety of interior and exterior signs in Perspex and Plexiglas adapted to every conceivable want and in more than sixty colours. These English plastics are imported in sheets up to ten feet square, but smaller sizes which run from a few inches square, such as door names and numbers, to four feet long and a yard wide for interior window display signs.

After each job is cut out and moulded under heat and pressure, the job is sanded, buffed and polished by modern electrically operated machines which are located in the upper floor of the new annex. The ground floor front is attractively arranged as a showroom with a great many samples of work on display. In addition to moulded plastic letters, metal and wood designs are available. Airbrush work on showcards continues to be a feature with the new organization.
