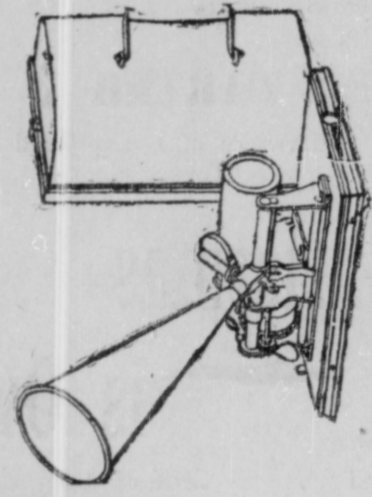

IN THE NORTH-WEST.

Great-Enthusiasm Prevails for the Conservative Cause and Success is Assured.

Mr. R. B. Bennett, I. L. B., of Calgary, a prominent lawyer, and a member of the Legislature of the North-West Territories, passed through Montreal on his way to his former home, Chatham, N. B., to spend the Christmas holidays. In conversation with a Star reporter he said:

"The Conservative party is at present organizing from one end of the country to the other. There are three constituencies returning Dominion members, Mr. Davin, for West Assiniboia; Mr. Douglas, for East Assiniboia; and Mr. Oliver for Alberta.

Mr. J. W. Connell, M. L. A., will probably contest Douglas in the Conservative interest, and will almost certainly win. It is also probable that Premier Haultain will run for Alberta.

"To show the utter demoralization of the Liberal party in the North-West Territories, only the other day the Liberals held a convention at Moose Jaw to nominate a candidate to run against Mr. N. F. Davin. There were so many internal dissensions that the convention broke up without doing anything.

"The Conservative party in the North-West Territories is a militant party today, eager and ready for a fight.

"In fact, all along the points of the railway line there have been formed, and are existing today, strong Conservative organizations.

"You can hardly conceive of the great enthusiasm evoked by the recent visit of Sir Charles Tupper. Magnificent meetings were held at Moosejaw, Indian Head, Regina, Medicine Hat and Calgary. On his return Sir Charles received a grand reception at Edmonton."

"At Calgary was manifested perhaps the most enthusiasm. An enormous crowd gathered to hear the Conservative leader. Mr. Sifton spoke at Indian Head, just prior to Sir Charles' tour. There was only an audience of 200 people present. The Tupper meeting took place soon afterwards, and the veteran was greeted by between 1,200 and 1,500 people.

"There was a remarkable lack of enthusiasm at the Sifton meeting. There is but little doubt that the Northwest Territories, as well as Manitoba, will go solid Conservative at the next general election.

"In the recent election in Dauphin, Manitoba, Messrs. McKenzie and Mann are credited with bringing 163 electors from Fort William to vote for Burrows. In fact, for corruption, the Dauphin election was another West Elgin.

"In connection with the sending of the second Canadian contingent, I may say that there are lots of horses, extremely hardy and used to firearms, in the North-West. There are also a great many ex-Mounted Police, who are very eager to go to the front. They would make an excellent showing in a warfare such as is being waged in South Africa.

"The New Zealand troops were under fire a few days ago and behaved so well that they earned the congratulations of General French.

"The foreign trade of Canada for the five months of the fiscal year up to the end of November shows a steady improvement in both imports and exports, the totals being away beyond the receipts of all previous years. Imports and exports together, for the five months amounted to \$168,071,842, an increase over 1898 of \$17,895,008. Exports amounted to \$89,116,898, an increase of \$7,629,745. Imports totalled \$78,954,944, an increase of \$10,184,263. The customs revenue for the five months reached \$12,231,270, an improvement of \$1,637,080.

LOYAL FRENCH CANADIANS

An Eloquent Exponent in Mr. Bergeron

At a banquet of the National Club, in Toronto a few evenings ago, speaking of the war in the Transvaal, Mr. Bergeron the talented young Conservative leader of Quebec, said: "I have heard it said here this evening that England is engaged in a just war. I will go further than that and say that it is not for us to enquire whether the war is right or wrong. (Applause.) For myself I say I am too far away to know." (Renewed applause.) For me it is quite sufficient that it is the cause of the Empire, right or wrong. (Great cheering.) We know that the Mother Country is engaged in the fight and it is the duty of every son of the Empire, if he has a heart in him, to support the Mother Country with all his power. (Loud cheers.) Gentlemen, it would be too long to give any explanation of the misunderstanding over the sending of the contingent to the Transvaal. But I am speaking for Quebec when I say that if the honest, loyal people of Quebec had not been misrepresented, you should have heard as much of their spontaneous loyalty as of the loyalty of Ontario, or any other province. (Hear, hear.) If you doubt what I say ask the militia men of this country if there were not more offers from Quebec than could be satisfied.

"And today, when we are about sending another contingent, I tell you confidently that Quebec will do her duty as loyally as any of her sister provinces. I think it is providential that the unity of our Dominion should be proved, as it could in no wise else be proved, by the formation of these contingents—(hear, hear)—and when our brothers land on the soil of Africa it will not be as Frenchmen or Englishmen, as Scotch or Irish, but as Canadians. (Cheers.) It is a Canadian contingent. At this Christmas time I come among you with the message 'Gloria in excelsis Deo, et in terra pax hominibus;' but I would translate this message for you: 'Glory to the British flag and to the peace it brings to all men whom it shelters.' Whatever the future of Canada may be within the Empire, or if it should come that we have independence, I say that England shall ever find us ready to help her whenever she stands in need of help." (Cheers.) At the conclusion of the speech the company sang "Rule Britannia."
