signed the petition, please do so.

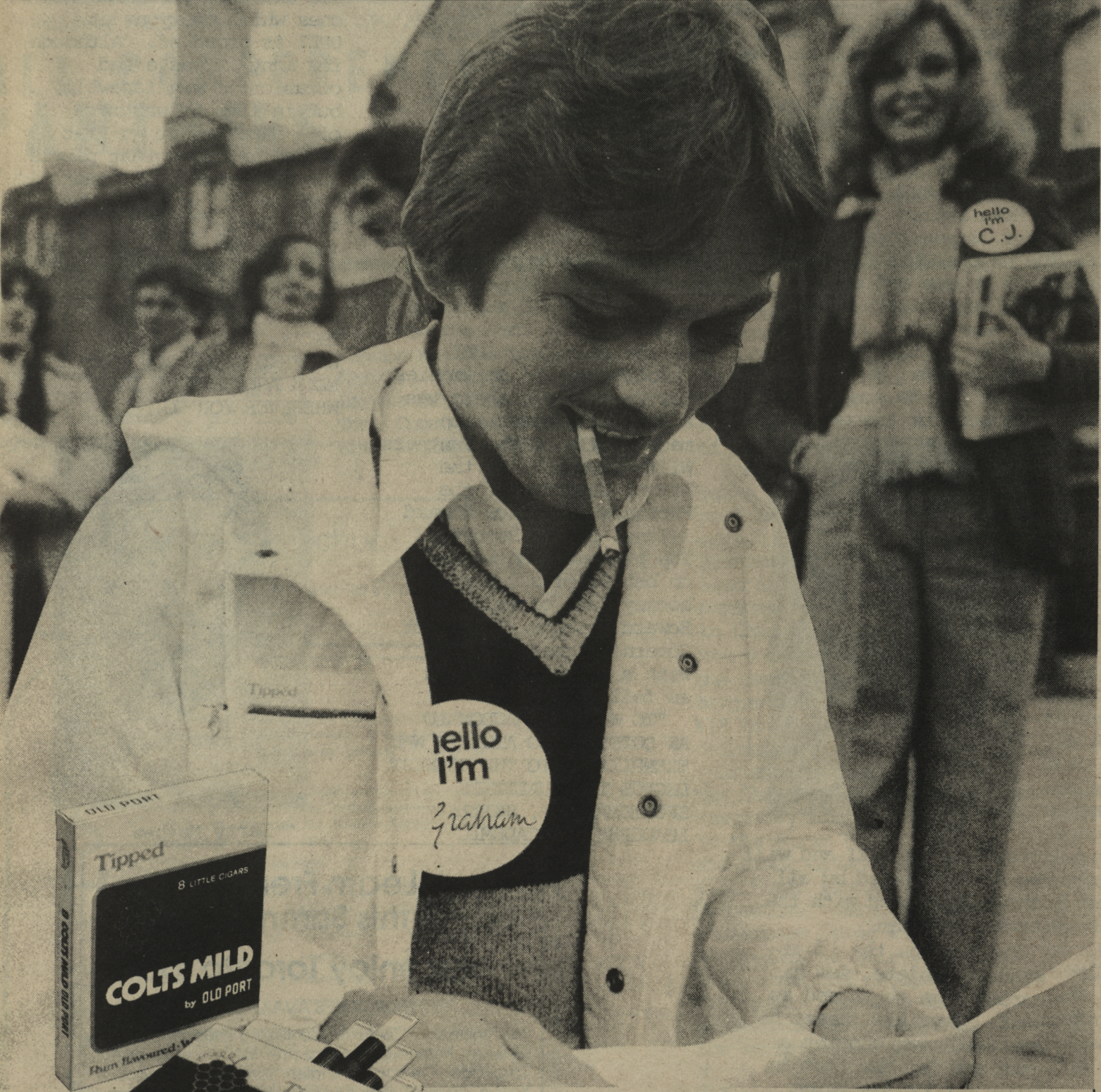
Remember: Don't miss this dinner because you will not be disappointed and will also have a good chance to make a few connections downtown.
