A VISIT TO THE MAGDALENES.

(Continued from second page.)

Olaf, and is still quite susceptible of peccation; but her shrill whistle awakens in the breasts of this contented fisher-community no burning desire to relinquish comfortable and happy homes to seek fortune, or shipwreck virtue, on the continent. To own a few acres of land and a snug cottage; to command with more pride than a Dewey or a Sampson one of the clipper fishing boats of the great Magdalen fleet; to bestow a tender care upon aged parents; to love and cherish a devoted helpmate; to provide for a numerous and promising family of children, and bring them up in the fear and love of God; to live at peace with his Creator, whose omnipotence is nowhere so recognizable, and to enjoy the respect of his neighbor—a man like himself in blood, creed, avocation, aspiration—such is the only ambition of the valiant Magdalener. But it must not be supposed for a moment, that he is wanting in public spirit, or ignorant or illiterate, or ready to be victimized by the sharper. The picture which Longfellow has left us of the community life of the peasants of Grand Pre might well reflect that of this community of Acadian fisher-folk:—
 "Alike they were free from
 Fear that reigns with the tyrant, and
 Envy, the vice of republics,
 Neither locks had they to their doors
 Nor bars to their windows;
 But their dwellings were open as day,
 And the hearts of their owner;
 There the richest was poor, and the
 poorest lived in abundance."

And, after all, who would want to exchange a life like this for the tinsel attractions of fame and riches, which in every case increase our cares and worries, and rob us of most of the natural pleasures which fill up the cup of the poor man's happiness! The Magdalener may not hope to lead great armies to slaughter, to speak to listening senators, to operate grand commercial enterprises, to be the leader of an often corrupt and corrupting society whose devotees live in great magnificence and luxury while every day poor Lazarus starves at their door; but how many of those in such high places could purchase with their fame or with their gold, in the pursuit of which their energies and years have been entirely consumed, the peace and contentment which is always his?

How do we reach the Magdalenes? Taking the train from any point on our railway, on Monday morning, we arrive at Souris in time for the steamer St. Olaf which awaits us on her return from Pictou, Georgetown and other ports. At ten o'clock all the freight for the Islands is snugly stowed away in her capacious hold; the lines are let go and we are afloat on a sea scarcely disturbed by a ripple and dancing in the silver light of the June full moon. We stop on the deck until East Point light is opened, and the wheelman takes his course NNE. for Entry Island Light, which, some sixty miles, guards the entrance to Pleasant Bay, a beautiful expanse of deep water encircled by Amherst, Grindstone and All Right Islands and the sand-bars which unite them. Then to our stateroom and to bed. After a refreshing sleep, disturbed only now and again, by the watch-bell and the monotonous thumping of the engines we are on deck again at 7 o'clock near the land, with Amherst Island on our left and Entry Island on our right and the long sand bar called Sandy Hook opposing our direct entrance to the Bay. At nine o'clock having gradually rounded the "hook" we were at anchor under Amherst town, the civil capital of the Islands, perched upon a bold promontory with slate colored cliffs and, by three considerable hills, called because of their verdancy or beauty (which?) "Les Membrs-pelles." The Judge of the Circuit, Belly by name, as well as some others of our passenger list, all genial companions, landed in the captain's gig with Her Majesty's mails. As our objective point was House Harbor, we stood on the bridge and spent the half hour's delay in listening to the banter of the bargemen as they took cargo from the steamer, in admiring the little town site, in spying out the other islands in the distance, or in scanning the seas already covered with the sails of boats and vessels. On the captain's return, we quickly weighed anchor and coasted along the land-locked side of the Bay until directly Cup-aux-menles, Grindstone Cape, out of the grey outlines of which we thought we made the exact picture of an old man's clear cut face, was reached. It is from this Grindstone point that the second Island takes its name. Turning sharply to the left here, we anchor again in what is called Leslie's Cove, where a gentleman of that name has extensive buildings and a wharf which serves as a landing place for boats. At this quay, the second landing is made in Pleasant Bay. The other two called for by contract are at Etang du Nord where the Government have exhausted all their energy in building a breakwater, and at Grand Entry where the steamers must drop anchor as at Amherst and Leslie's.

DIAMONDS IN AMERICA.

Half a Billion Dollars' Worth Owned Here—Amount Rapidly Increasing.
 In no country are there more diamonds to be found than in the United States, according to the population. It is estimated by a leading Maiden Lane (New York) diamond dealer that there are upward of \$500,000,000 worth of diamonds in this country. Moreover, this vast amount is increasing year by year.

Until quite recently diamonds were rarely cut in this country, but American inventors have developed a process for diamond cutting which is vastly superior to that done abroad. The loss in weight through cutting is sometimes fully one-half, but the value is increased probably more than two-fold. The Dutch city of Amsterdam has been the great diamond cutting center of the world from time immemorial and up to a few years ago over 12,000 people in that place were directly or indirectly dependent upon this trade.

But it was not reasonable to suppose that Amsterdam should continue to hold a monopoly of diamond cutting. As one of the greatest importing cities of the world, New York gradually offered inducements to diamond cutters, and an industry has been gradually built up here that is now very flourishing and profitable. In 1858 Henry D. Morse of Boston invented a machine for cutting and polishing diamonds, and since then improvements have been made upon it that are very important. The foreigners continue to polish their stones by hand, but in this country machinery is largely used.

A famous gem expert places the total value of all the diamonds in the world at over \$1,000,000,000, of which \$350,000,000 worth are in the hands of dealers, carried as stock. All of the other diamonds are in the hands of private individuals, and the question naturally arises, who owns them? This is not so easily answered, except in the case of large and world famous gems.—Godey's Magazine.
