Largest Catering Job Is Feeding Camp Gagetown

Feeding the 10,000-odd soldiers during the present training concentration at Camp Gagetown, the Royal Canadian Army Service Corps is confronted with the largest individual catering job in the country.

The Service Corps will handle more than a thousand tons of food during the six-week period, with an average daily total of over 68,000 pounds of edibles, ranging from 502 pounds of fresh milk to 14,950 pounds of dehydrated soup. The officer in charge of the huge task, Lieut. David A. Guy, said the whole country will get into the act of supplying the 1st Canadian Infantry Division and supporting troops. The Maritime Provinces in their role of a supplier will provide potatoes and fish, Columbia will supply hundreds of cases of apples. In the providing of potatoes the food processing plant at Bedeque has been contracted to supply hundreds of cases of canned potatoes.

As well as foodstuffs, the Base Supply Depot issues such necessities as matches, Keady foot-powder, disinfectants and fly-cos. Two very important articles also included are insect repellent and 23,000 lbs. of ice daily. The problem of satisfying some 10,000 healthy Canadian appet-
