At Christmastime, we recall that if we are distant from Christ, still He is not far away. We can say with St. Paul, "Rejoice, again I say rejoice, The Lord is near." He is in the midst of us and He is born in our hearts when true charity comes to life there; that is when we begin to love not only those who love us but those who do not. The only way we can love a person who hates and despises us, is to remember that Christ died for that person. If we can love him at all, it is through Christ's love within us.
