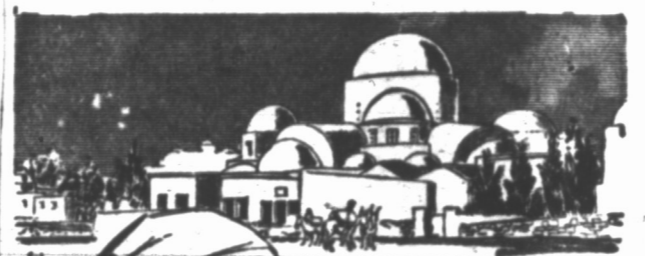
Dr. Samuel B. Hadden of Philadelphia said he has been successfully treating homosexuals for the last 10 years.

Anti-Malaysian Plot Is Crushed

KUALA LUMPUR (AP)—Destruction of an Indonesian-inspired plot to promote armed revolution in Malaysia was announced by federal police Friday.

Three Malaysian political leaders, who oppose Prime Minister Tunku Abdul Rahman's policies, were charged with conspiring to slip into Indonesia and set up a rebel government-in-exile as part of President Sukarno's campaign to crush the British-backed anti-Communist federation of Malaysia.
