CONTRACT BRIDGE

South dealer.
Neither side vulnerable.

The bidding:
South West North East
1st Pass 1st Pass
2nd Pass 2nd Pass
3rd NT

Opening lead—six of hearts.
West was in an awkward position to choose an opening lead, all four suits having been bid, and decided to lead a heart. East won with the ace and returned a heart.
Declarer took the king, and with nine sure tricks in sight, led the ace of diamonds, then the jack, which held, and finally another diamond.
South could not be prevented from getting to dummy with a spade, and wound up with two spades, two hearts, four diamonds, and two clubs.
A spade lead originally by West would have defeated the contract, but there is doubt that West can be faulted for having failed to find the killing lead. He

had a difficult choice to make. There is no doubt, however, that East's defense was inadequate. After winning the ace of hearts he should have returned the jack of spades.
There is quite a difference between choosing a blind opening lead, before seeing the dummy, and choosing the subsequent defense, after dummy's hand is seen.
There are two reasons why the spade should not be returned and not the heart. First, it is an attacking lead designed to promote tricks for the defense if, by any chance, West obtains the lead again.
Second, and far more important, is the fact that it attacks dummy's entry. The long diamond suit, from East's viewpoint, is very threatening. Obviously, on the bidding, declarer will be able to establish dummy's diamonds very quickly.
The only entry to the diamonds, after they are established, is in plain sight—the K-Q of spades. That entry must be destroyed at once. Hence, the jack of spades lead.
Declarer cannot recover from this stroke. He can huff and puff, but he can't blow the house from under. He can win the spade and lead diamonds, but from dummy, trapping the king, but East need only be careful not to cover with the king.
Without the diamond suit South can make only eight tricks. Eradication of dummy's entry is the killing blow.

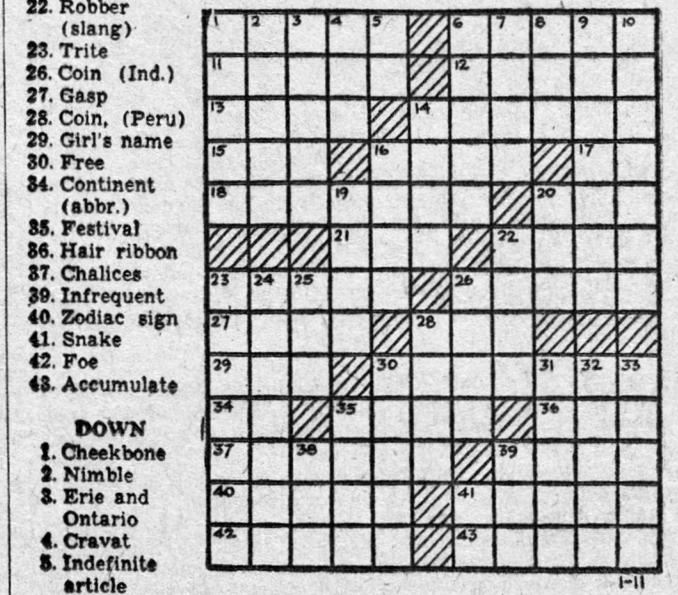

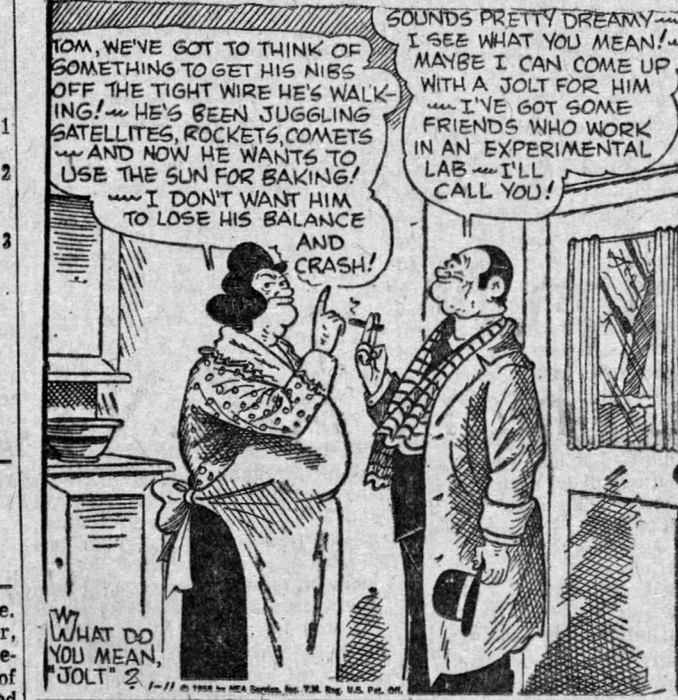

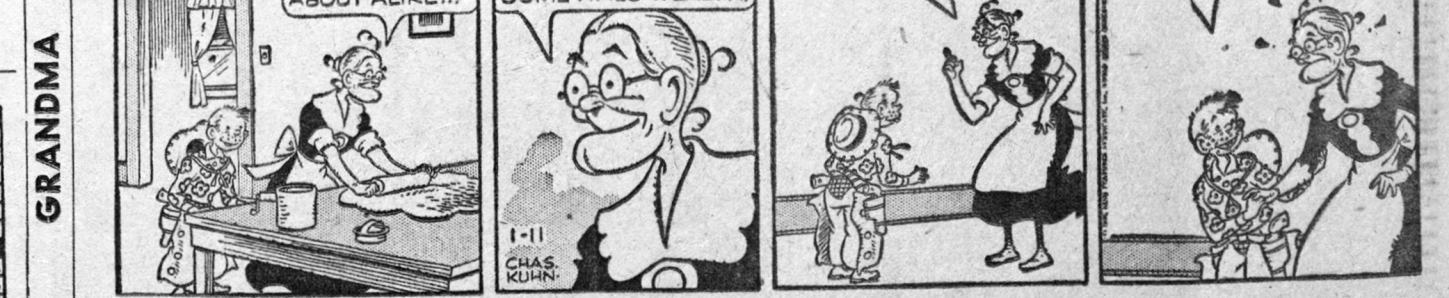
