SYDNEY (CP)—Two wire-drawing machines from the Dominion Steel and Coal Co. steel plant here were being loaded aboard railway cars Friday for shipment to the Dosco mill at the Toronto suburb of Etobicoke.

There was no immediate comment from company officials. Dosco announced several weeks ago the machines would be transferred to its Etobicoke plant, leaving three wire-drawing machines in operation at Sydney.

The announcement of the transfer resulted in widespread speculation over the future of the Cape Breton steel mill, but the company assured there would be no effect on the plant's overall operations.
