

# We got SCHMUCKED

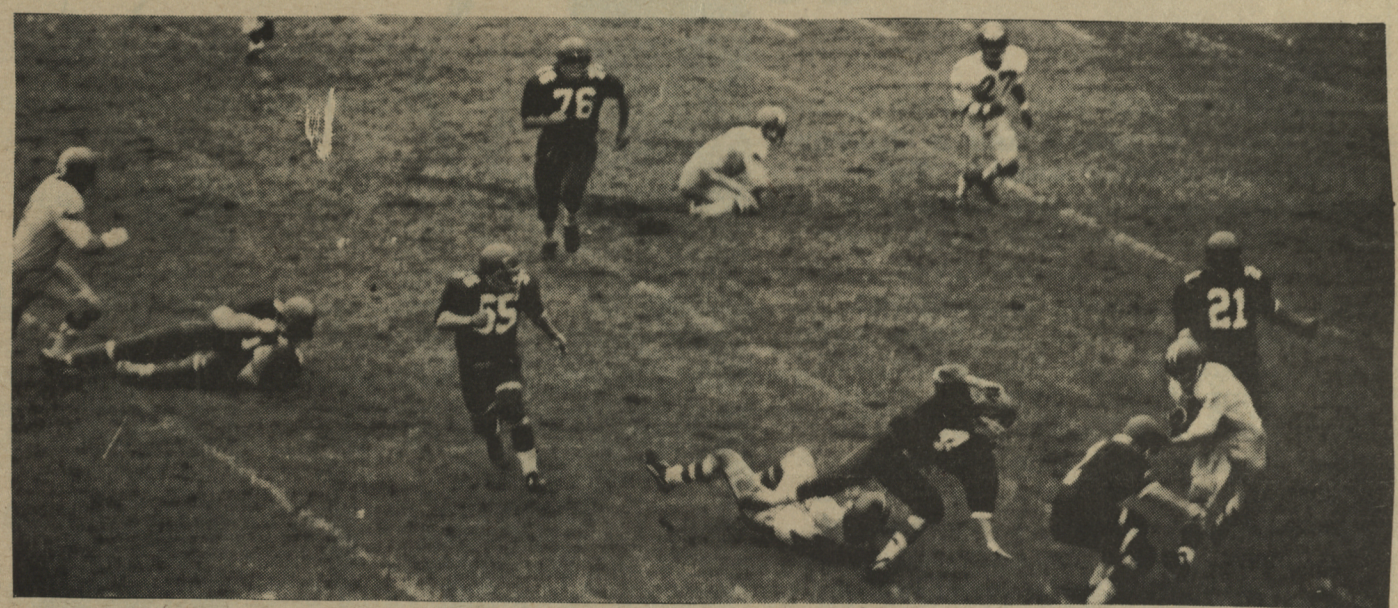
