## Union Local Requests Conciliation Board

Minister of Labor Henry Wedge has been requested by Local 628 National Union of Public Employees to grant a conciliation board, to assist the local in getting a signed working agreement with the Prince Edward Island Hospital, M. A. Hughes, Saint John, National Union of Public Employees representative, said last night.

Mr. Hughes said negotiations have been going on for more than three years and an agreement was reached in the Province of Ontario on Oct. 11, 1962 but "to date no contract has been signed due to the failure of the Hospital Services Commission to approve the terms of the contract."

Terms include a seven per cent increase in wages retroactive to July 1, 1962, a \$5 per month increase in the second year of the contract, a 40-hour week to be implemented in December, 1963, and a union shop for present members and for new employees.

"This union has been negotiating for three years in an attempt to get a signed agreement but in all cases this has proved impossible because of the Hospital Services Commission refusing to supply the funds to implement the contract," Mr. Hughes said.

"We entered negotiations in 1961 but both hospitals and couldn't get anywhere because both hospitals refused to deal with costs items on the grounds the Hospital Commission wouldn't approve them," Mr. Hughes said.

He stated that as a result of a hearing on this matter and a report of the Labor Relations Board, Mr. Wedge instructed both unions and hospitals to start negotiations without referring to the Hospital Commission.

Mr. Hughes further stated Mr. Wedge said a conciliation board would be granted failing agreement to be reached in the event that agreement was reached and the Hospital Commission failed to approve the contract.

"Such negotiations resulted in an agreement being reached between Local 628 and the P.E.I. Hospital."

"To date no agreement has been reached between the Charlottetown Hospital employees local union and the Charlottetown Hospital," Mr. Hughes noted.

**SAVE TERMS**

He points out, however, Local 628 reports they are prepared to accept the same terms as accepted by the P.E.I. Hospital and Local 628, and are awaiting reply from the Charlottetown Hospital Board.

Mr. Hughes said, in an attempt to settle matters without resorting to a board, he participated in a meeting of all parties concerned including Mr. Wedge, the Minister of Health and the chairman of the Hospital Services Commission.

"I was informed such a meeting was impossible due to the absence from the Hospital Services Commission chairman, and the fact the minister of labor was too busy with election duties to deal with departmental matters at this time."

Mr. Hughes expressed the wish that the matter will be settled without further delay.
