Did you know that the women of pioneer days produced their own dyes from the materials about them, and that dyeing kettles were a part of every housewife's gadget?

It might be interesting to women readers to learn just how past generations of Island women made a beet red dye. Here is the recipe:

It is copied from an old note book which came into my possession recently.

"To a gallon of water add five large beets. Boil until the vegetables lose their color. Strain the liquid through cheesecloth. Dissolve 4 ounces of powdered alum in two gallons of water and soak the material to be dyed in this solution for a couple of hours.

When the beet juice comes to a boil, immerse the material and boil for one and a half hours, turning the material over and over during the process."
