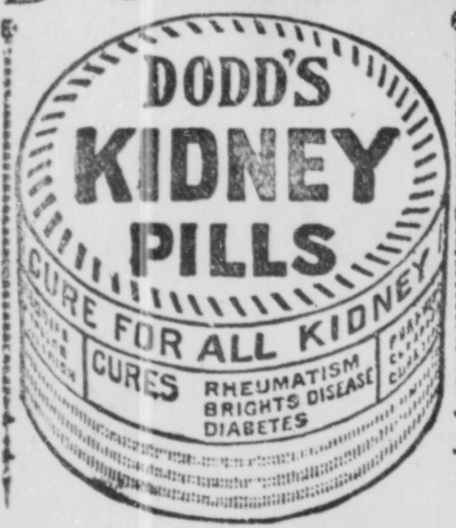

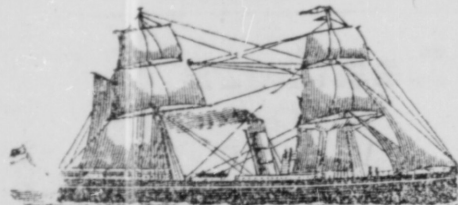

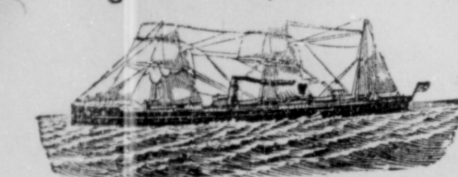

The Transvaal War

Grievances in the Transvaal.

The dispute between Great Britain and the Transvaal has centered so long around the franchise that to many that issue must have come to appear the cause upon which the case for war must rest. As a matter of fact, the whole laboriously discussed franchise issue is but a short cut, which was proposed by Sir Alfred Milner. Great Britain has rather over a dozen definite complaints against the government of the South African Republic, and Sir Alfred put forward the widening of the franchise as a means of avoiding an interminable correspondence, fraught with opportunities for a rupture, over each of these individual grievances. On March 25 the famous Outlanders' petition to the Queen was forwarded to the Imperial authorities, who felt impelled to take cognizance of its contents. Upon deciding to take notice of this complaint, Sir Alfred Milner found himself in a position of some difficulty. In a despatch which he sent to Mr. Chamberlain about this time he remarked that the Boer government officials maintained an extremely disagreeable attitude in all dealings with him, and that he abstained as much as possible from representations upon the numerous matters in which Transvaal and British interests clashed owing to the rasping tone which the Transvaal was sure to assume. This, it must be borne in mind, was during the two years in which Sir Alfred maintained an attitude of studious reserve upon South African politics. When the British Government concluded that it must press for a redress of grievances suffered by its subjects in the Transvaal, it found ready an extraordinary variety of complaints. One London journal has enumerated no less than eighteen breaches of the convention of 1884. To effect a satisfactory settlement, Great Britain would have to engage in diplomatic disputes with the Transvaal upon the following heads:

- 1 Privileges of British Vice-Consul.
- 2 Swaziland protocol.
- 3 The alien expulsion act.
- 4 Non-submission of treaties.
- 5 Dynamite concession.
- 6 Dynamite concession in Swaziland.
- 7 Extradition agreement.
- 8 Prosecution of Webb and Dood.
- 9 Tax on non-burgers.
- 10 War service for foreigners.
- 11 Disfranchising Jameson burghers.
- 12 The general franchise question.
- 13 Treatment of Cape boys.

Besides the constitutional questions a number of specific grievances existed, such as the murder of Edgar, and such matters of general interest as the subversion of the independence of the High Court.

Such a list of grievances contains an enormous amount of inflammable matter. Sir Alfred Milner accordingly proposed the widening of the franchise as a means of getting rid of the whole list. "Let the Outlanders become citizens," he virtually said, "then let them by their votes redress all these grievances for themselves, and Great Britain can stand aside." Before Great Britain could abandon the Outlanders to make good their position by their own exertions, she had to make sure that they would be granted a fair field; hence the tenacity with which the details of the franchise question were debated.

forty miles to Van Renen's Pass, seventy-eight miles to Newcastle, about fifty miles to Helpmakaar, where Boer forces have been observed. Sir George White's 12,000 men are strung out along a line which must be over fifty miles long. General Joubert's forces are in a curving line which must be 120 miles in length; his right at Acton Homes is rather south of Ladysmith, and the next force mentioned is at Bester's, twenty miles northward. Fifty miles northeast of this, and across the rugged Biggarsberg Ridge, is Dannhauser, where another force has been seen: and to reach Helpmakaar, where Joubert's left seems to be, a circuitous route of some fifty miles would have to be taken. These various forces are not only widely spread, but are separated by steep and difficult hills and numerous watercourses and rivers. To work them together like a team of horses must require very accurate timing and extraordinarily careful arrangements. The forces operating along this extended line may be guessed at 16,000 strong, although some disposition exists to regard them as stronger. Obviously, they must be split up into a number of rather small columns. Sir George White has a far shorter line along a railway. A few days ago, when the Free Staters first began to stir in Van Reener's pass, Sir George brought one battalion down to Ladysmith from Glencoe, and subsequently sent it back again. The ease and speed with which he shifted his force from one wing to the other is highly instructive. It illustrates the advantage of "interior lines" possessed by Sir George; the Boers are operating on "exterior lines," and their separated columns, once committed to an advance will find it hard to aid each other. Theoretically, it should be practicable for Sir George to concentrate a superior force upon some of the scattered Boer columns, and so obtain a superiority on the spot. Stonewall Jackson often found himself in such a position, and invariably with exceedingly painful consequences to the Union armies. It must be remembered, however, that the Boers are believed to be nearly all mounted, and so may be expected to possess greater mobility than the British force. This may, of course, militate against Sir George's efforts to fall upon one of the converging columns; Stonewall Jackson's feats were made possible by his superior mobility, due to the extraordinary marching powers of his infantry who always outstripped the federal infantry.

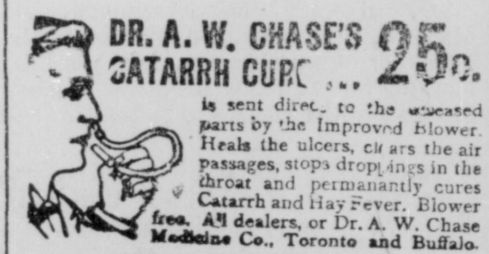

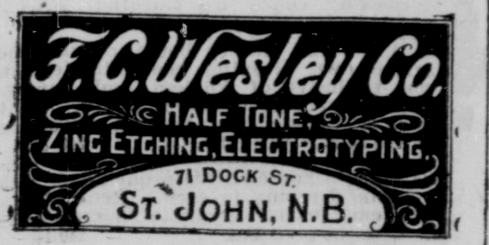
