GREAT excitement is manifested in New York on account of the probabilities of an European war. The British Consul, however, considers the rumors as being exaggerated. Berlin despatches discredit the warlike attitude of Russia.

MEMBERS of the British Emigration Delegation were interviewed by a reporter of the *Halifax Herald*. They give a glowing account of Manitoba, and say there will be a large immigration thither in the spring.

AT THE recent meeting of the Licensing Board, a petition was read from numerous citizens, praying for an alteration in the 18th Section of the License Law, which enact that "All retail dealers be prohibited from keeping their bars open later than nine o'clock at night, from the 1st of November to the 1st of May," and "not later than nine o'clock on every Saturday evening during the year." The Board passed a resolution altering the said section and permitting tavern keepers to open their houses at seven o'clock in the morning and close them at 10 on all nights in the year, except Saturday night, when they shall close them at nine o'clock.
