Dodgers Beat Braves 5-3

MILWAUKEE (AP) — Two home runs by Gil Hodges and another by Don Demeter in a battle of homers powered the Los Angeles Dodgers to a 5-3 victory over the Milwaukee Braves Monday night.

Eddie Mathews and Joe Adcock homered for Milwaukee. The contest was the first of a three-game series and dropped Milwaukee from first to third place in the National League pennant race.

The victory boosted Johnny Podres record for the young campaign to 3-2 and handed Milwaukee-hurler Warren Spahn his third loss against as many victories. Spahn was lifted for a pinchhitter in the ninth and Art Fowler was sent in for Podres to hold the Braves.

Mathews' homer was his ninth of the year and gave him the major league lead for round trip swats. Spahn was trying for this 25th victory in his career.

The 29-year-old surgeon has specialized in the study of extra-sensory perception.

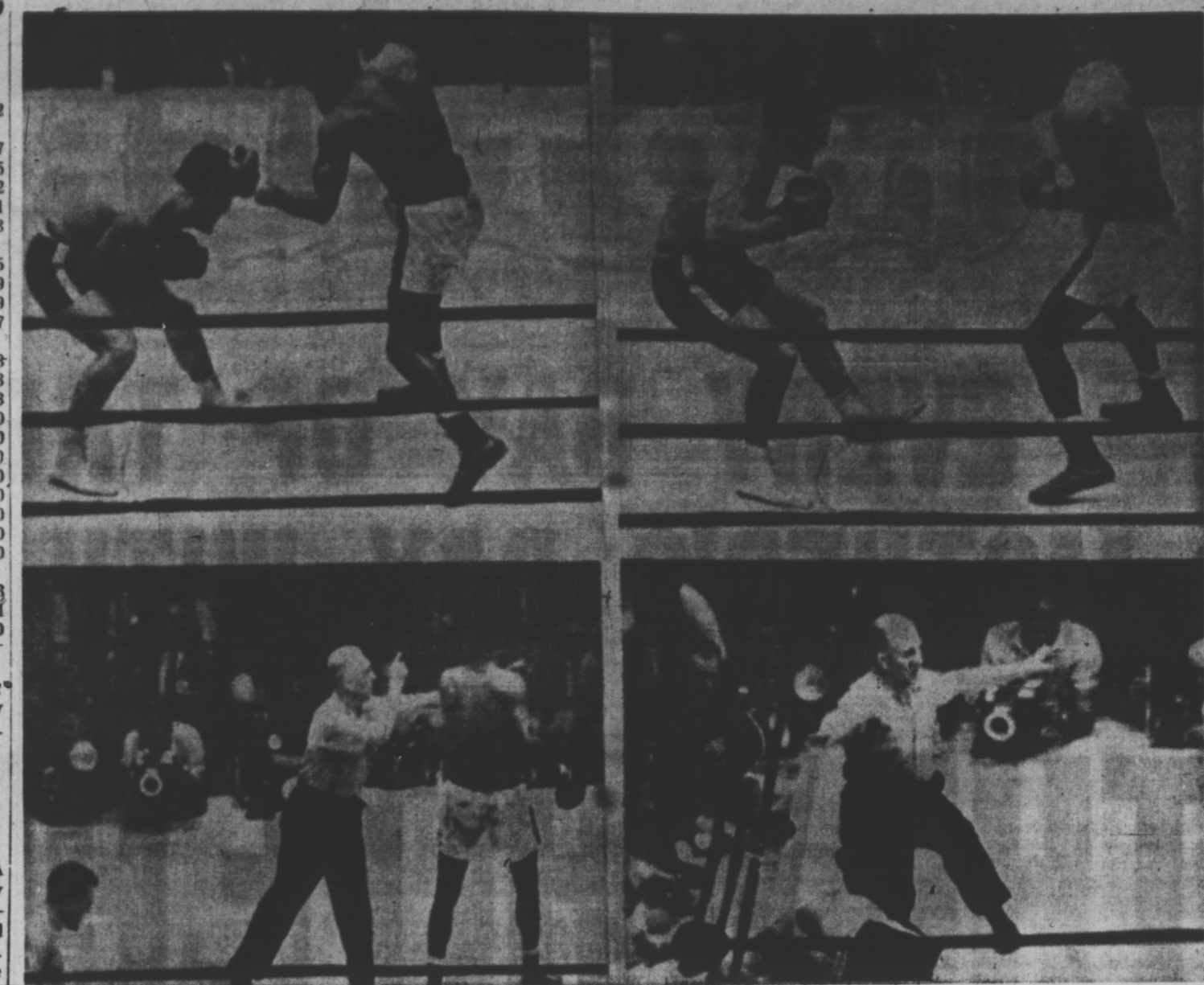
Pirates Shade Baby Bears 2-1

PITTSBURGH (AP) — The Pittsburgh Pirates drove Bob Anderson from the mound with a two-run eighth inning outburst Monday night and took over fifth place in the National League with a 2-1 victory over the Chicago Cubs.

Dick Groat, started Anderson's downfall when he opened the Pirate eighth with a double. Anderson got the next two batters out but Rocky Nelson, pinch hitting for Kline, scored Groat on a single. Roberto Clement drove in the winning run with a single and ended Anderson's hope of picking up his fourth straight victory of the season. The loss was his first.

Giants Edge Redlegs 6-5

CINCINNATI (AP) — The San Francisco Giants edged into the National League's first place Monday night, getting past the Cincinnati Redlegs, 6-5, with a ninth inning rally. The Giants now are 609 percentage points ahead of the Los Angeles Dodgers who won from Milwaukee.

Cincinnati blew an early one-run lead in the ninth when the Giants finally caught up with Reds ace, Bob Purkey, for four runs. The big blow was Jim Daventport's bases-loaded double. Reliever Gordon Jones collected the victory, but it took Jack Sanford to preserve it in the ninth.

'Kid' Howard Squares Off Against N.Y. Lad Tonight

HALIFAX (CP) — Canadian lightweight boxing king Richard 'Kid' Howard of Halifax sets his sights on another crack at the British Empire crown tonight (Tuesday) when he meets Irish Tommy Nethercott of New York, a tough youngster with plans of his own. They square off in a 10-round main event at the Forum here tonight.

Al Backman, New York manager of Nethercott, said his fighter is in the best shape of his career. "We're on our way to the top if we can stop Howard," Backman said. He said he thought the bout would go the distance.

"Tommy has never been stopped," Backman said, "and I don't think Howard can do it." The Canadian champ, making his 1959 debut, will tip the scales at 137. Nethercott, 24, will probably weigh in at 133 or 134. He will have almost a two-inch height advantage of the five-foot-one Howard.

Official weigh-in is scheduled for the Forum at noon today. Promoter Clary Harris indicated Howard would probably demand a rematch with British Empire lightweight champion Willie Towell of South Africa if he beats Nethercott. Howard lost a unanimous decision to Towell in Johannesburg in 1956.
