Former P.E.I. Broadcaster Lent To Ghana Government

Sydney R. Kennedy, of Halifax, Maritime Regional Program Director for the Canadian Broadcasting Corporation, has been appointed a special advisor to the Ghana government.

Mr. Kennedy left Sunday for Montreal on the first leg of a 9,000 mile trip which will take him to the West African country via London.

For the five-week period which he will spend in Ghana, Mr. Kennedy will be on loan from the CBC to the Economic and Technical Assistance Branch of the Canadian Department of Trade and Commerce. His duties in Ghana will be to make a survey and report to the government on the advisability of setting up television service in that country.

Mr. Kennedy's appointment is further recognition of his vast experience in the field of broadcasting. Early in 1954 he spent four months in England on an

Imperial Relations Trust Bureau during which he trained with the British Broadcasting Corporation in radio and television techniques.

Mr. Kennedy was born in Chatham, N. B. He began his career in radio as an announcer-operator with station CFCY in Charlottetown, P.E.I. in 1937. He joined the CBC in Halifax in 1941 and for the next year and a half served as announcer at Sackville, N.B., and returned to Halifax as chief announcer in 1942. Shortly after that he was promoted to senior producer. In 1946 he became station manager of CBA and CBH and in 1952 moved into the position of regional program director.

In his capacity of regional program director, Mr. Kennedy is responsible for the overall supervision of all CBC programming in the Maritimes, both radio and television.

Mr. Kennedy is well-known for his many contributions to the community life in Halifax. He is a member of the Halifax Commercial Club and the Halifax Press Club. He is a director of the Halifax Symphony Society and director of the Nova Scotia Division of the Canadian Arthritis and Rheumatism Society.

He is married to the former Eleanor Fair, of Wolfville. They have three children, Derek 8, Gay 6 and Krista 2 1/2.
