Britons Reading More Than Ever

LONDON, Jan. 2 - (Reuters) - Britons today are reading more than ever before and are becoming increasingly serious-minded in their choice of literature.

Librarians report a growing demand for non-fiction, autobiography, travel and science books. At the same time they report a big drop in light romances and detective fiction.

A leading publisher suggested that it may be simply because people are satiated with escapist novels and want "something real" for a change.

"Fiction has been too dull and too much the same for many years," one publisher said. "People want something new and will seize on a fresh book, like the 'Kon-Tiki Expedition'."
