

**Local and Other Items.**

E. F. RUSSEL, of the firm of Russel & Co., Boston, is on a visit to this city. He is staying at the "Rankin."

HIS WORSHIP Mayor Dawson has gone to Toronto on an important mission in connection with the finances of the Methodist Church.

OWING to the absence of the Stipendiary Magistrate from the city, there was no Court this morning. Three cases on the docket stands over till Monday.

D. H. McDONALD, Esq., of Bedeque, caught a trout at Murray River Bridge, on Tuesday last, that weighed 3 1/2 pounds, and measured 19 inches in length, and 11 inches in circumference.—K. C. Advertiser.

MR. I. C. HALL, of this city, shipped by steamer Worcester to Boston, yesterday, one hundred and fifteen barrels of mackerel. This is the first shipment of mackerel from this port the present season. Mackerel are at present worth \$8 per barrel.

MRS. WM. HEAROLD, of Dalhousie Settlement, Annapolis County, N. S. has a hen four years old that, up to a year ago, was perfectly black, and laid constantly, when a change gradually to take place. The color changed to white; she has stopped laying and taken to crowing instead. She has raised a comb, and set herself up as a phenomena generally.

AN Ottawa despatch to the St. John Telegraph says:—A despatch from Winnipeg, received on the 15th, states: It is rumored that Governor Laird's residence at Battleford and the Government offices are held by the Indians. There is no telegraph at present with Battleford. The rumor is not generally credited.

THE steamer Worcester sailed for Boston on Thursday evening with a cargo of 2,587 boxes lobsters, 527 cases eggs and 118 barrels mackerel, valued at \$15,460. She had also on board the following passengers: Miss McDonald, Miss McAskill, Mrs. Marsh, Miss Maggie McLeod, Miss Annie McLeod, Mr. Joseph McAdam, Mr. Nelson Rattenbury and wife, Mr. Phippey.

THE Prince of Wales, mentioning the dead Prince Imperial the other evening, said:—"I can only say that a more charming, a more promising young man has rarely existed. If it had been the will of Providence that he should have been called to succeed his father as sovereign of that great country, our neighbor, I believe he would have proved an admirable sovereign; that he, like his father, would have been a true and great ally of this country."

THE market to-day was well attended. Prices were as follows: Beef, (small) per lb., from 6 to 12 cents; do., per gr., from 4 to 8 cents; mutton, from 5 to 10 cents; veal, from 3 to 7 cents per lb.; lamb, per lb., from 6 to 10 cents; butter (fresh) 13 to 16 cents; do. (tub) from 12 to 13 cents per lb.; chickens, from 35 to 45 cents; ducks from 50 to 60 cents; potatoes, from 32 to 36 cents; oats, from 36 to 40 cents; eggs, from 10 to 12 cents per doz.; hay, from 35 to 40 cents; green peas (per qt.) 25 cents.

A HEAVY storm passed over this Province last night. It was accompanied by vivid flashes of lightning, thunder, rain and hail. On St. Peter's Road the lightning struck and demolished a tree alongside the residence of Mr. Andrew Duncan. The occupants of the house were much affected by the shock.—At Brackley Point Road another tree was struck by the electric fluid. The ground, for several chains, was shaken, and men who saw the occurrence were terrified by subsequent awfully vivid flashes.—At Covehead very heavy showers of hail fell, doing considerable damage to the crops.—The rain in the western section of the Province is reported to have been very heavy, though no damage to the crops is so far reported.

SUPREME COURT, KING'S COUNTY.—The following cases have so far been disposed of: John McPhee vs. Thomas B. Hall—action on note of hand. Verdict for the plaintiff for \$191.67. James R. MacEwen vs. Julius Cox—judgment confessed for \$103.86. George F. Campbell vs. Michael Mullally—judgment confessed for \$82.90. George J. Wright and another vs. John G. Profit, an absent debtor—verdict for plaintiff for \$132.54. Duncan R. Reid vs. Roderick McKenzie—judgment confessed, subject to certain conditions. Adam Darling vs. Michael Gregory—judgment confessed for \$90.73. Michael Sweeney vs. the estate of the late Capt. Angus Steele, an action to recover wages—verdict for plaintiff for \$196.70.—K. C. THE Parker girl was liberated on Wednesday, and went on her way rejoicing. The Parker girl was never in the slightest danger of being convicted of perjury, except in company with a good many others. "The Osborne family," it is telegraphed "have returned home from Dorchester, not having the means to prosecute the case." It will be remembered that at the close of the preliminary examination at Moncton, when Justice Wortman sent the Parker girl up for trial, the dentist, Campbell, made a statement which materially strengthened the testimony of the Parker girl, and in the event of the perjury case being prosecuted, the public would have been anxious to have further light thrown on this new development in the case. The McCarthy matter drops out of sight for the present, but we shall be greatly surprised if it finally ends with the Attorney-General over ruling Stipendiary Magistrate Wortman. That a barbarous murder was committed in Shediac very few persons have any doubt, and the murderer or murderers are still at large.—St. John Sun.

**Trouble in Newfoundland.**

Advices by the S. S. Alhambra, report a strike of miners at the Little Bay mine and a suspension of shipment of ore. The owners had given notice of a reduction of wages on the 1st inst., to which the men would not submit. The result would be disastrous to both masters and men. The North Star says:—"It has for some time past been a matter of a grave question how, in view of the competition in copper production, the low rate at which the ore is sold and the decreasing percentage in value of property, that the business is still carried on. Already operations at Bett's Cove have been very much curtailed, not more than 400 men being employed there now against 11,000 last fall. The yield of ore for 1878, is only 25,000 tons against 44,000 tons in 1877."
