West had no reason to feel that a lead of the unbid heart suit would

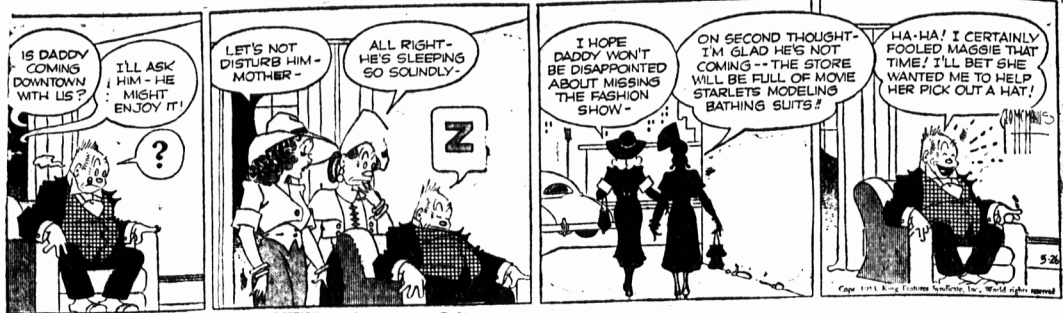
