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CONTRACT BRIDGE

The bidding:  
South West North East  
2♠ Pass 2NT Pass  
3♠ Pass 4♠ Pass

In attempting to solve problems of this type, the simplest way to begin is to discard from consideration all possible divisions of the adverse clubs where South's choice of whether to play the nine or the queen makes no difference in the result.

Thus, if West's club holding is A-K-10, it does not matter what declarer plays. He is down, and nothing can help him.

Similarly, if the adverse clubs are divided 2-2, South's play is immaterial. The defenders will make only two trump tricks, regardless of what declarer plays, since the next time clubs are led the two remaining honors will crash together.

In the same way, a 4-0 trump break is irrelevant because declarer cannot control the result.

The only pertinent case is the one where clubs are divided 3-1 and West has the singleton. This singleton can be only the ace, king, or ten.

Since there is more chance—2 to 1, to be exact—that West's singleton is either the ace or king rather than specifically the ten, South should follow the percentages and finesse the nine.

In the actual case, the percentage play would have won.

Nickel Strike Talks Continue

TORONTO (CP)—The new round of negotiations aimed at settling the International Nickel Company strike was adjourned Tuesday until today to give union leaders time to consider an undisclosed proposal.

The adjournment came after a session lasting only 90 minutes. Chief conciliation officer Louis Fine said the union "wants time to look into something."

Threatened Trade War Is Averted

PARIS (AP)—A threatened European trade war was averted at least temporarily early today by agreement among 17 nations to study British and French compromise plans.

Wary negotiators put off a final decision until Jan. 15. But a six-nation European common market will go into effect as scheduled next Jan. 1.

The compromise plans were not made public in detail. Informants said the conferees agreed that the offer of the remaining 11 members of the Organization for European Economic Co-operation will become effective with the new year.
