Early Wynn Is Named AL Comeback Player Of Year

NEW YORK (AP)—Early Wynn rebounded from two poor seasons and won the most games in the major leagues in 1959. He helped push Chicago White Sox toward their first American League pennant in 40 years.

For starting life anew at the advanced pitching age of 39, Wynn Wednesday was named the American League comeback player of the year in the annual Associated Press poll.

Wynn edged outfielder—first baseman Tito Francona of Cleveland. Pitcher Hoyt Wilhelm of Baltimore was a distant third.

Wynn received 61 votes among the 168 cast by members of the Baseball Writers Association of

America. Francona drew 52 and Wilhelm 21.

Wynn was a 22-game winner this season after registering only 14 victories in both the 1957 and 1958 campaigns.

Wynn's last good year was 1956, when he had a 20-9 record for Cleveland. After a 14-17 mark with the Indians in 1957, he was traded to Chicago with Al Smith for Minnie Miñoso and Fred Hatfield.

The White Sox' right-hander wound up with a 3.13 earned run average this season.

Francona batted .363 in '59 after gaining a position in the Indians' regular lineup on June 1. He did not, however, qualify for batting title, finishing with fewer than the necessary 477 total appearances. Francona was one of the big surprises of the cam-

paign, hitting 20 homers and driving in 79 runs.

HIT .254 IN 1958

Francona was acquired from Detroit a month before the start of the 1959 season. He hit only .254 in 1958 with one home run and 20 rbi.

Wilhelm won 15 games for Baltimore. He led the majors in earned run average with 2.19. The veteran knuckleballer had a 15-3 record with New York Giants in 1952 and was 12-4 with the same club in 1954, the last time it won the pennant. He was strictly a relief pitcher until Baltimore manager Paul Richards gave him an opportunity to start in 1958.

Wilhelm's 1958 record was 3-10, although he pitched a no-hit, no-run game against the Yankees in the final week.

Ottawa Riders Let Youngsters Back In Park

OTTAWA (CP)—The youngsters and the city police will be back in Lansdowne Park for next Saturday's Big Four Football game here.

But the youngsters will watch the games from behind a wire enclosure to keep them off the field.

And city police won't be chasing youngsters to retrieve footballs—leaving that task to the private constabulary that has been policing the field so far this year.

Police Chief Reginald Axcell agreed Wednesday to have city policemen on duty in the park, but he specified they will be there to preserve order. The football club "has other men to chase footballs," he said.

Until last Saturday, the youngsters had been sold up to 1,600 bleacher seats for 75 cents each. But last Saturday the children's tickets were discontinued because of running onto the field in "previous games."

The Ottawa football club Wednesday yielded to parental pressure to let the youngsters back in, but decided to erect a wire netting in front of the west-end stands to keep them off the field.

Baer's Namesake Drives Too Fast

SACRAMENTO, Calif. (AP)—Max Baer, former heavyweight boxing champ, wondered Wednesday whether he has an unknown namesake who likes to drive too fast.

A news dispatch from Harrisburg, Pa., Tuesday night said Baer was fined \$20 for speeding 75 miles an hour on the Pennsylvania turnpike.

"I was here at home in Sacramento Tuesday," Baer told The Associated Press. "In fact, I've been here constantly for three weeks and I haven't been in Harrisburg for three or four years."

"There's something else," too. Now that my three children are growing up, I've slowed down on the highway. I never drive at 75. My night life has slowed down, too."

Mrs. Baer joined in: "I'd sure like to see a picture of the man who got ticketed. I don't see how anyone could be taken for Max."

And at Harrisburg, a state trooper said, "it was all a mistake."

Trooper Robert J. Uscowska said the Max Baer arrested for speeding was asked before a justice of the peace whether he was the former prizefighter.

"The man just smiled and somebody took it that he was," said the trooper.

Riders' Thelen Gets Deferment

OTTAWA (CP)—Dave Thelen, Ottawa Rough Riders' fullback, has received deferment from United States military service until Dec. 1, coach Frank Clair reported Wednesday.

There apparently still is a possibility that Thelen can get into the reserves, thus splitting the two-year compulsory military training period into six-month units. That would let him continue his football career unhindered.

WON'T RENAME HORSES

Race Horse Owner Has Case In Supreme Court

OTTAWA (CP)—What's in a horse's name?

Nothing, says William Morrissey, Toronto thoroughbred breeder, who owns six race horses with the unusual names of Hot Ice, Stole The Ring, Red Nose Clown, Irenes Orphan, Rabbit Mouth and Into The Grape. Plenty, claims the Ontario rac-

ing commission which says the names were chosen to cast ridicule on Fred Orpen, retired racing magnate who formerly owned the Long Branch track near Toronto.

That is the background of a case brought before the Supreme Court of Canada Wednesday by Morrissey and Christina Blanche Armstrong. Miss Armstrong leases the horses from their joint company and races them in Ontario.

The racing commission in May, 1957, ordered Morrissey to rename the horses or face a commission order that would bar the horses from racing on Ontario tracks; and, consequently, elsewhere in Canada and the United States.

commission from carrying out its threat to bar the horses. The Ontario court of appeal quashed the writ and now the race owners are asking the Supreme Court of Canada to restore it.

During the court proceedings, which started in June, 1957, the horses have continued to race at various meets.

Arthur Maloney, counsel for Morrissey and Miss Armstrong, argued in court Wednesday that the racing commission has no power to bar the horses because of their names, or to order a renaming which would involve getting permission of the New York Jockey Club, central registry of thoroughbreds foaled in Canada and the United States.

Mr. Maloney, Progressive Conservative member for Toronto Parkdale, said there was no evidence Morrissey sought to injure Orpen—the two had a feud in 1946—and an affidavit signed by Morrissey denied any intent to do so.
