Just to prove we are not PERFECT at U.P.E.I. our girls lost a good game at the U. de Moncton 76-67... however they are mostly

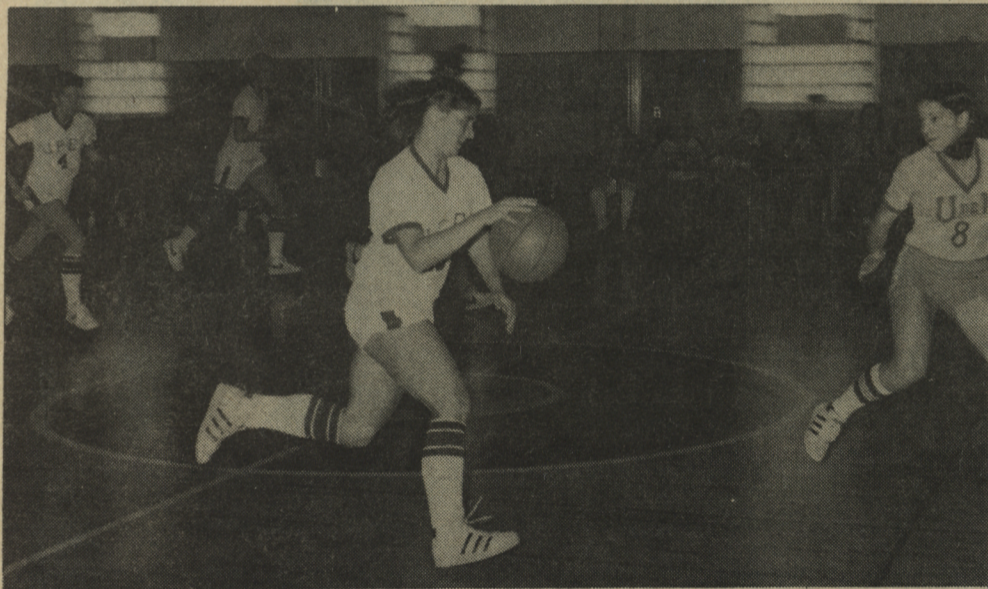
