CONTRACT BRIDGE

Partner bids. One Heart, next player passes, neither side vulnerable. What would you now bid with each of the following four hands?

- 1. ♠A7 ♣QJ65 ♦A7M ♣KQ72
2. ♠AQ72 ♣9 ♦A8765 ♣K96
3. ♠98743 ♣84 ♦AQ6 ♣Q72
4. ♠KQ782 ♣Q643 ♦72 ♠A5

1. Three hearts. The jump raise in partner's suit announces a 13 to 15 point hand and is forcing to game. Distributional values are counted as well as the fit in the trump suit. The jump raise therefore says in effect that there is an opening bid facing an opening bid, which in turn indicates there is a game.

It is not necessary or desirable to name either of the minor suits. Such calls are reserved for stronger and longer side suits. 2. Two diamonds. It is uncertain at this point just where the best contract lies. As accurate information as possible should therefore be conveyed to partner about our distribution.

The intention is to follow the expected two heart rebid with a bid of two spades. Partner will thus be informed that the spade suit is only four cards long, and since the diamonds were named ahead of spades on the previous bid that they are of greater length.

We have enough high card strength to force the hand to game, but we need partner's assistance to help find the best contract.

3. One spade. It is far better to respond with one spade than one notrump, which many players are inclined to do. Weak as the spade suit is, it offers a chance to find a playable trump suit whenever the opener has as many as three spades.

The margin of eight trumps to the opponents' five is a satisfactory one, even where strength in the suit is lacking. If the five-card suit were not mentioned because of its weakness, it would become next to impossible to discover the fit in spades whenever the opening bidder had three of them. He could hardly be expected to name a three-card suit.

4. Two hearts. It is more important to identify immediately the heart fit than it is to show the spades. A direct raise to two hearts indicates 6 to 9 points, including adequate trump support, and these are the values we have here. The objective of bidding a spade is that if partner's rebid happens to be two hearts we will be faced with an awkward situation. To bid again would constitute an overbid; to pass would result in suppressing the heart support.

Preliminary Hearing Opens In Teen-Age Slaying Case

OTTAWA (CP)—Witnesses testified Wednesday that Robert O'Leary died of a steak-knife wound in a street fight between two youthful gangs after a restaurant fracas sparked by a girl's taunt.

The testimony was given at the opening of a preliminary hearing into murder charges against five teen-agers, accused following the Nov. 23 slaying of 20-year-old O'Leary on west-central Somerset Street.

Charged are: James McDermott, 17, Thomas John Drain, 19, William Robert Post, 19, his brother, James, 16, and Henri Dupuis, 19, all of Ottawa.

Norma Innis, 17, testified that trouble started at the O'Leary and two companions shared a late snack in a restaurant after a party at which some drinking had been done.

"BUNCH OF PUNKS" Miss Innis said a group of youths entered using "pretty bad" language. She had asked them "to watch it" and the other girl with her, 18-year-old Anna Halchuk, had said not to pay any attention because the youths were "just a bunch of punks."
