

# PRESIDENT DESIGNATE TO ADDRESS STUDENTS

The Student Council held their second meeting of the year last Sun. The Executive of the student union will travel to Mt. Allison during the weekend of Sept. 23-24th. Acting S.U. President Gerlad MacKenna cited the reasons for the trip. "Our executive feels we should be working closer to Mt. A since their school is similar in size and close at hand. Primarily the meeting will be to establish block booking with Mt. A so that both universities can bring in larger bands.

The two executive will discuss common goals and concerns such as student union business management and campus police policies. The chairman of the Social Committee Debbie MacMurdo will also attend. "Some other things we will examine are how they sponsor their union sub-committees and get these groups started," stated Gerlad MacKenna.

The President Designate Dr. Peter Meincke has been invited to address the student body sometime in November. The executive

The chairmen of the personnel board Monica Driscoll presented the recommendation that Mrs. Julie Watson be appointed the new Sec. of the S.U. Since that time the Sun has learned that Mrs. Watson is unable to accept the position since she has acquired another. Ms. Driscoll informed council that six had applied for the position.

Treasurer John Neville reported on the set advertising rates made by the

Sun's editor Larry Green and CIMN station manager Maurice Rodgers. In a previous meeting council had been upset over the low advertising rates that the student union's newspaper had been using. According to Advertising Mgr. John Flemming the union has been locked into several long term contracts for the newspaper, at the low rates. The new rates are now \$96 for a full page ad. An advertiser who places 4-8 ads will pay 80 dollars a page or 48 a page for a year round contract. Smaller ads such as one half, one quarter, or one eighth a page will be priced according to size.

Communications Officer Mike Mahon designated that the middle pages of the Student Directory be used for advertising only at the total cost set at \$320. This concept was to offset the price of publishing.

A special meeting of council has been called for Sun. Sept. 25 so that the personnel board's recommendations may be passed by the student council.
