HOFFA INDICTED
CHICAGO (AP) - James P. Hoffa, Teamsters' union head, and seven associates were indicted Tuesday by a federal grand jury that charged them with fraudulently obtaining loans from the Central States Pension Fund. The indictment contained 28 counts and followed two years of investigation by the grand jury and the Federal Bureau of Investigation.
