Dear Mary Haworth: My brother is a widower with three young children. He lost his wife six months ago and his heart is not on rearing these children. But the problem is, where to find a capable person to care for them while he is at work? He is willing to pay, but can't pay much as he makes only a modest wage, out of which he has to pay rent, etc.

Dear S.T.: There is a Family Service Society (so-called), also a few Community Service Societies, in the city you identify as your brother's "area."

While there are federal allowances of sorts to help widows with minor-age children, I am not sure that widowers get the same aid. However, the aforementioned agencies can research exact information on that score for your brother.

The regulation solution of the widower's problem, in caring for young children, is to find a housekeeper - a sturdy, kindly older woman in need of a home for wanting independence who can be a sort of live-in grandmother, doing the housework and tending the babies, in exchange for board, keep and a small wage.

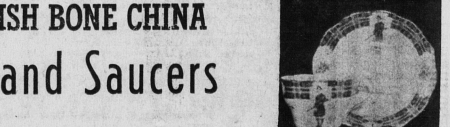
