### EDUCATIONAL COLUMN.

#### NUGGETS.

I. Mosquitos may leave, but backbiters we have always with us.

III. "Debt, dirt, and the devil," says Spurgeon, "are three bad things, and, while the latter, serpent-like, may wriggle in, the two former may be kept out by hard work, honesty, and scrubbing-brushes." See that your school-room is scrubbed and swept as often as is necessary "Cleanliness is next to godliness," and lessons in cleanliness cannot be taught in a dirty schoolroom.

IV. Have all written work in the schoolroom done neatly and legibly. Pay strict attention to writing in copy-books clean and devoid of blots. Endeavor to have your school win one of the diplomas offered for competition in this Column.

V. Do not give your pupils long lessons in reading. It is better to have them read two paragraphs well than to read four fairly well, or eight in a stumbling, mumbling fashion.

VI. Have review exercises occasionally. Be sure that every lesson makes an impression on the mind of the child. The task forgot as soon as said is no good. Give every pupil to understand that what you tell him he must tell you at some date in the near future. In teaching, as in mercantile affairs, it is well to take stock occasionally and see where you are drifting.

VII. Too many school-boys form cattle-pens for Farmer Everybody's cattle during the summer nights. Teachers should insist on trustees and ratepayers to have the school lot fenced in—fenced with neat, attractive fence.

#### PRIZES FOR PENMANSHIP.

That teachers may be encouraged to pay more attention to the teaching of Penmanship and that pupils may endeavor to write neatly and legibly. Inspector M'Cormac offers for competition among the schools of the Eastern Inspectorate thirty neatly gotten up, and tastefully printed diplomas which will be awarded to those pupils who send to the Inspector the best writer copy books. This competition opens on August 15th, 1900, and closes June 15th, 1901. It is to be hoped that every school within the Inspectorate will compete. Each pupil competing must give name of school he or she attends, age at last birthday, grade to which he or she belongs, name of teacher, and certificate from teacher stating that the work contained in copy-book sent is the writing of the pupil and was done during school hours. All writing exhibited shall be done in the vertical system, as that is the system authorized for use in our schools. Writing is not satisfactorily taught in majority of schools, legibility, neatness, and fluency can certainly be secured with proper care and supervision; but it is necessary that there shall be real teaching in this subject if

success is to be attained. There is too much go-as-you please work, the teacher having a Latin or French class or working an exercise in Geometry while the pupils below the sixth grade are doing their writing exercises in copy-books.

#### MORAL TEACHING IN CHINA.

In China, for twenty centuries past, the great object of moral teaching has been to inculcate reverence for ancestors, devotion to parents and kindness to brothers and sisters. The popular stories of China turn mostly upon family affections.

An English missionary, Mr. A. E. Moule, has translated into English a book of Chinese moral tales used in the schools of China. One story is this:

There was a very naughty boy named Han, whom his mother used very often to whip, but without making him shed a tear. But one day after being flogged, he cried; whereupon his mother asked him why he did so. "Oh, mother," he answered, "you used to hurt me when you flogged me, but now I weep because you are not strong enough to hurt me."

There is a curious story of a boy of eight, named Woo Mang, which means Brave and Talkative. He was wonderfully dutiful to his parents who were so poor they could not afford mosquito nettings for their bed. So Woo, early in the evening, used to get into his parents' bed, and let the mosquitos bite him without disturbance for an hour or two, and then, when they were filled with his blood, and could bite no more, he would get out and call to his parents to go and sleep in peace.

The work is filled with such tales as these. Family duty seems to be the religion of the Chinese people, and Chinese families live together in peace and harmony. Many of their popular sayings express a very elevated kind of moral feeling. For example; "Use men as you use wood. If an inch is rotten you must not reject the whole piece." "Think of your own faults when you are awake and of the faults of others when you are asleep."
