### \$2,066,642 Debt Increase Is Forecast For The Present Year

An increase in the debt of the Province of \$2,066,642 as of March 31 was revealed in a statement comparing ordinary revenues with the estimates for the fiscal year which ends Monday. The statement was tabled in the Legislature yesterday by Hon. W. E. Darby, Provincial Treasurer.

year it was estimated that the total needed would be \$8,731,788 while the actual expenditure amounted to \$9,377,727 representing an increase in the debt of the Province of \$2,066,642 more than the \$1,138,821 planned for in the estimates prepared for that year.

There was in the Department of Health and Welfare an amount of approximately \$70,000 less expended than had been estimated for. This was largely due to the Government having to spend less than planned for old age pensions. The Minister of the department has estimated the cost of this division at \$1,265,000 for Old Age Pensions and \$60,000 for Blind Pensions. The forecast of the expenditures reveals that both totals will be lower with the former at \$1,020,000 and the latter at \$55,000. The estimate for the entire Department is \$1,120,000.

- FREDERICTON, March 28 (CP) — A government bill introduced in the New Brunswick Legislature today would allow private car owners to carry passengers to and from work without the necessity of a motor carrier licence.
- HALIFAX, March 28 (CP) — Municipal Affairs Minister R.M. Fielding today introduced a bill in the Nova Scotia Legislature which will enable towns to impose a poll tax on women. The bill gives all towns power to impose a maximum tax of \$10 on working women who earn more than \$1,000 annually.
