### Scholarships

First we would remind our readers of the scholarship offered by the T. Eaton Co., Ltd. to boys who are not yet twenty three years old October 20th of this year.

The winner of this scholarship will receive a four year course at an Agricultural College and the successful candidate for the province, a free trip to the Royal Winter Fair.

Applicants must complete High School by the spring of 1953, those who have already started University work are not eligible. Applications should be made to "E. C. Wright, Box 9, Charlottetown."

### Nuffield Foundation Scholarships

The Nuffield Foundation offers one scholarship or western and one for eastern Canada to either men or women engaged in practical farming and from twenty five to thirty five years of age.

The winners are provided with six months free travel and study with British farmers. Application forms are available from the Federation of Agriculture, Box 99, and should reach this office in sufficient time for mailing to Ottawa by November 1st.

### Strikes and Results

Strikes are a tool or a weapon used by workers as a last resort to enforce demands for higher pay, better working conditions or fairer treatment in general. The justification for a strike may often depend upon the sense of fairness and justice evident in Union leaders.

Farmers in general are not in a position, nor do they show any inclination to hold up production by means of striking. Farmers realize that high production per man is vital to their welfare and that they cannot expect to receive good incomes unless they earn them.

They want the opportunity to earn by producing and they want to make sure they get what they earn. But, high production in the rest of the economy is also essential. Unless high production per man in agriculture is accompanied by high production in the rest of the economy, farmers are at a disadvantage.

The products they sell are in abundance and cheap; the things they buy are scarce and dear.
