HE WILL BROOK NO OPPOSITION TO HIS WILL.

BERLIN, Feb. 25.—The speech of the emperor at the banquet of Bradenburgers, in which he indulged in one of his spread-eagle declarations that he would lead the empire to glory and would brook no opposition to his methods, is the sensation of the hour.

The consensus of opinion is that the speech was a very indiscreet one, but the emperor has committed so many indiscretions of this kind that no great surprise is created by the most recent instance of the kind.

The strong resemblance between this utterance and the famous threat made on a similar occasion over a year ago, that the emperor would "grind to powder those who opposed him," is freely commented upon.

The statement was made at the time of the declaration that the Kaiser had indulged somewhat liberally in wine before he delivered his speech.

People are now saying the same thing about his conduct at the Bradenburg banquet; but it is hardly necessary to attribute such remarks on the part of the emperor to intoxication. In his calmest moments he is inspired with the conviction that he is a divine agent, and his inscription in the golden book of Munich, to the effect that he was a mere acknowledgment of this feeling, and not intended as a snub to the king of Bavaria; at least this is the explanation given by those who claim to understand his character well.

The emperor does not need the exaltation that comes of wine, therefore, to imbue him with the idea that he is invincible against his enemies.
